Mayor Eckert explained the disaster procedures. Mayor Eckert reminded anyone speaking this evening to step up to a microphone because the meetings are being taped and posted the next day on the website.

City Attorney Garrett Hoerner and Johnny Anthony excused.

There was an article by Mr. Cook which The Edge was named as a recipient in the TIF giveaway program. They were viewed as one of the winners picked where the Mayor picks the winners and losers.

Mr. Schell stated they have not received a dime, not one nickel. They have been charged more. They received abatement on sales tax for building materials for improvements so they did not have to pay sales tax to the state which the city would have received a small portion.

They received a 25% reduction on incremental tax increases due to improvements made to the property and that is on the TIF portion only. They invested a lot of money, received an increase on their tax bill of \$20,000 and received \$1,800 back. Let's do the math, they are paying \$18,000 more in property taxes with \$1,800 rebated back; therefore, the city is doing okay.

Regarding the present plan is 50% on incremental tax increases. As a business they will have a \$30,000 on property taxes and the city will rebate \$4,600. The amount of tax revenue is considerable. The amount of sales tax to the city, taxes to the county and taxes to the state far exceeds their income. They receive zero benefits and taxed more. They appreciate the sales tax abatement and the small kickback on their real estate taxes.

Stewart Lannert

He was out at the Shrine and there was no one in sight and \$500,000 worth of moving equipment. There is no work on the gas station that was approved. Has anyone talked with the State regarding the turn off lanes for the project? Lindenwood comes to Belleville and ignores all the codes and laws and Belleville pays them \$150,000/yr. They could have paid for police cars and policemen with \$150,000. The students need to use common sense while crossing the street.

The drug dealers in Belleville are around grade schools and the police do nothing about it.

(AS AMENDED)**

This amended agreement made this ~~15th~~^{6th} day of ~~August, 2016~~^{March, 2017} by and between the City of Belleville, Illinois (the "City") and **Dahm & Schell, Inc.** ("**Dahm & Schell, Inc.**");

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Dahm & Schell, Inc. intends on investing a minimum of ~~\$3,363,000.00~~^{\$3,660,000.00} to complete the remodeling and expansion of the existing facility located at 701 South Belt West in Belleville (the "Project"), and;

WHEREAS, the parties have reached an agreement in order to set forth the terms upon which the City would provide certain economic incentives for the Project and the terms upon which **Dahm & Schell, Inc.** would provide jobs at said location, and;

Responsibilities of the City of Belleville

1. Certification of project's location in Belleville Enterprise Zone for the Exemption of Sales Tax on Building Materials used exclusively for the remodeling and expansion of the existing family entertainment facility (Savings estimated at \$152,685.00) located at 701 South Belt West.
2. Rebate 50% (estimated at \$9,684.00 annually) of incremental property taxes directly related to improvements at 701 South Belt West for five (5) years or until the expiration of TIF #3, whichever is first.

Responsibilities of Dahm-Schell, Inc.

- A. Dahm & Schell, Inc. shall commit to a private investment at 701 South Belt West of no less than \$3,363,000.00, including but not limited to the remodeling and expansion of the existing family entertainment facility no later than ~~June 30~~^{December 31}, 2017, and;
- B. Dahm & Schell, Inc. shall commit to retain forty-five (45) FTE jobs, and;
- C. Dahm & Schell, Inc. shall commit to create ten (10) additional FTE jobs within the first year of operation, and;
- D. Dahm & Schell, Inc. shall commit to create three (3) additional FTE jobs within the second year of operation, and;
- E. Dahm & Schell, Inc. shall commit to annual sales subject to sales tax of no less than \$600,000.00, and;
- F. Dahm & Schell, Inc. and/or successors shall commit to remain and operate at the site for no less than ten (10) years, and;
- G. Provide monthly updates to City staff on project progress during construction, and;
- H. Compliance with all existing and applicable Federal, State, County and Local laws and ordinances.

Penalties

In the event that **Dahm & Schell, Inc.** fails to meet its obligations under Sections (A), (B), (C), (D), (E), (F), (G) or (H) of the section entitled "Responsibilities of **Dahm & Schell, Inc.**" of the Development Agreement, all public funds provided under (2) of the section entitled "Responsibilities of the City of Belleville" received to date as per the Development Agreement from the City of Belleville shall be repaid to the City of Belleville and all remaining amounts to be provided if any, shall be terminated.

Miscellaneous

1. Entire Agreement. This Agreement and any written amendments hereto shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. Neither party shall be bound by any terms, conditions, statements or representatives, not herein contained. Each party hereby acknowledges that in

executing this Agreement it has not been induced, persuaded or motivated by any promise or representation made by the other party, unless expressly set forth herein. All previous negotiations, statements and preliminary agreements by the parties or their representatives are merged in this Agreement.

2. Validity. It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that if any part, term, or provision of this Agreement is held by a court of law to be illegal or in conflict with any law of the State of Illinois, the validity of the remaining portions or provisions shall not be affected, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced as if the Agreement did not contain the particular part, term or provision held to be invalid.
3. Notices. Notices, or other communications required or which may be given under this Agreement shall be in writing, and delivered either personally, or by certified or registered mail, to the addresses indicated for each party below after their respective signatures, or to such other address as designated by a party similar notice to the other party. Date of notice shall be the date of delivery in the case of delivered notice or the date of posting in the mail in the case of mail notice.
4. Signage. Agree to allow City to place on the premises a sign indicating financial assistance has been provided by the City of Belleville for a minimum of fifteen (15) days each before and after opening of the facility.
5. Current with Payments. Agree to pay in full the City of Belleville on any outstanding invoices containing the name or names of the individual, company and/or corporation receiving the said inducements.
6. Execution of Agreement. If this agreement is not fully executed within sixty (60) days of City Council approval, it shall be considered null and void.
7. Prevailing Wage. Projects receiving incentives/inducements from the City of Belleville will be required to comply with the President's executive order no. 11246, as amended (prevailing wage).
8. Superseder. This Agreement supersedes and replaces any and all prior agreements and understandings between the City and **Dahm & Schell, Inc. and/or Dahm & Schell, Inc. d/b/a The EDGE** with respect to the subject matter hereof.
9. Request of Payment. The party receiving inducements must officially request payment from the City. This must be done via letter to include documentation of private investment, jobs created, etc. as outlined in the section titled "**Responsibilities of Dahm & Schell, Inc.**".

Amended Grass and Yard Maintenance Agreement

This Grass and Yard Maintenance Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into this (approval date to be inserted), by and between the City of Belleville, Illinois (the "City") and Minton Outdoor Services, Inc.

Recitals

Minton Outdoor Services, Inc. operates a lawn care service located at 11 N. 48th St. Belleville, IL 62226.

The City provides for the maintenance of grass and yards for City owned, condemned and vacant property (periodically), complaint driven ("as-needed"), drainage areas and easements ("monthly") (~~Bi-Monthly amended to Periodically~~) throughout the City: and

The City desires to have the yard and grass maintained in an economical, safe and workman-like manner; and

Minton Outdoor Services, Inc. desires to accept the City's yard and grass maintenance jobs in accordance with the terms set forth in this Agreement.

Agreement

For and in consideration of the terms set forth in this Agreement, and other goods and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree:

1. Except as otherwise set forth in this Agreement, the City agrees to have Minton Outdoor Services, Inc. maintain the grass and yards of those city owned properties, complaint driven properties, drainage areas and easements as designated every year.
2. Mowing Specifications:
All lots are required to be cut with a 2" – 3" height.

"As Needed" mowing and yard maintenance for various lots and properties will be expected to be cut within 48 hours of notification from the City. All **"as needed"** lots will require digital photos of "before and after" each grass cutting to evidence that lots need cutting. Photos are to be dated and addressed and turned into the City with the accompanying billing.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the **Greater Belleville Chamber of Commerce** assumes full responsibility for the direction, protection, and regulation of the traffic during the time the detour is in effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that police officers or authorized flaggers shall at the expense of the **Greater Belleville Chamber of Commerce** be positioned at each end of the closed section and at other points (such as intersections) as may be necessary to assist in directing traffic through the detour.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that police officers, flaggers, and officials shall permit emergency vehicles in emergency situations to pass through the closed area as swiftly as is safe for all concerned.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all debris shall be removed by the **City of Belleville** prior to reopening the State highway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such signs, flags, barricades, etc., shall be used by the **City of Belleville** as may be approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation. These items shall be provided by the **City of Belleville**.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the closure and detour shall be marked according to the Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an occasional break shall be made in the procession so that traffic may pass through. In any event, adequate provisions will be made for traffic on intersecting highways pursuant to conditions noted above. (Note: This paragraph is applicable when the Resolution pertains to a Parade or when no detour is required.)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that to the fullest extent permitted by law, the **Greater Belleville Chamber of Commerce** shall be responsible for any and all injuries to persons or damages to property, and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Illinois Department of Transportation, its officers, employees and agents from any and all claims, lawsuits, actions, costs and fees (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) of every nature or description, arising out of, resulting from or connected with the exercise of authority granted by the Department which is the subject of this resolution. The obligation is binding upon the **Greater Belleville Chamber of Commerce** regardless of whether or not such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in part by the act, omission or negligence of the Department or its officers, employees or agents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the **Greater Belleville Chamber of Commerce** shall provide a comprehensive general liability policy or an additional named insured endorsement in the minimum amount of **\$1,000,000 per person and \$2,000,000 aggregate** which has the Illinois Department of Transportation, its officials, employees and agents as insureds and which protects them from all claims arising from the requested road closing. A copy of said policy or endorsement will be provided to the Department before the road is closed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Illinois Department of Transportation, District 8, to serve as a formal request for the permission sought in this resolution and to operate as part of the conditions of said permission.
