**Michael Hagberg**

Mr. Hagberg stated on May 21, 2018 he commented on TIF 16 only having \$164,000 in the fund with claims of \$284,000 and about to approve another project for \$200,000. The administration assured him and the aldermen that the funding was coming from this year's property taxes and a grant reimbursement. Yet, the treasurer's report was printed a week later and shows that

\$250,000 was transferred from TIF 3 to TIF 16. This transfer of funds comes without being presented nor approved by the city council. Government is designed as a series of checks and balances. How is a treasurer to verify fund balances when the administration is transferring funds without council approval. By blindly accepting the actions of others you are failing taxpayers who voted you into office. The administration lied to him and the aldermen about taking money from TIF 3. Let's get the \$200,000 transferred back to TIF 3 where it belongs and can be used repairing streets.

## RELEASE AND SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

This Agreement (“Agreement” or “Release”), made on June\_\_\_\_, 2018, between **Plaintiff Michele Brock (“Plaintiff”)** and **Defendant City of Belleville (“Defendant”)**;

### **WITNESSETH:**

**Whereas**, there is presently pending in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Illinois, a lawsuit bearing case no. 17-CV-0218-JPG-SCW between **Plaintiff and Defendant**, wherein the **Individual Defendant** Michael Seibel (“**Individual Defendant**”) was named.

**Whereas**, the parties, having had the advice of their respective counsel have determined that it is in their individual and mutual best interests to settle and compromise fully and finally any and all claims on the terms and conditions contained herein;

**Now**, therefore, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. **RELEASE OF CLAIMS:** **Plaintiff**, being of adult age and being otherwise competent to execute this document, for the sole consideration of **\$4,000 (FOUR THOUSAND DOLLARS AND 00/100)**, which will be paid by check after this Agreement is fully executed, do hereby and for herself, her heirs, successors and assigns, release, acquit, and forever discharge **Defendant**, and all its affiliated and related entities, elected and appointed officials, and its agents, servants, employees, successors, heirs, assigns, and their attorneys and primary and excess insurers, including but not limited to the City of Belleville, Illinois (including any of its police officers involved in this incident), the Illinois Counties Risk Management Trust and Illinois Program Managers Group, and all other persons, firms, corporations, associations, or partnerships of and from any and all claims, actions, demands, damages, expenses, and compensation whatsoever, which the undersigned now has or which may hereafter accrue on account of or in any way growing out of any and all known and unknown, foreseen and unforeseen claims, expenses, injuries and damages allegedly arising out of the **Plaintiff’s** contacts with **Defendant** and **Defendant’s** actions on March 1, 2015, which claims are the subject matter of the above lawsuit, the pleadings of which lawsuit and all papers filed in support thereof are adopted herein by reference. **Plaintiff** acknowledges that this Release covers claims and causes of action for any form of damages, whether compensatory, punitive, statutory, or otherwise, and includes claims and causes of action for all forms of costs, fees (including attorney fees), or expenses, which accrued or arose as of the date of this Release. **Plaintiff** further acknowledges that she may discover facts and legal theories in addition to or different from those of which she is now aware. Claims, causes of action, and suits arising out of any or all matters released herein that are based upon facts or legal theories unknown as of the date of this Release are barred by this Release. **Plaintiff** further waives the right to rely upon any statute, rule, or common-law doctrine which precludes the release of claims, causes of action, or suits arising from facts which are not known or are different from those known when a release is executed. It is further stipulated by **Plaintiff** that said action shall be dismissed with prejudice and without costs.

**Plaintiff** agrees that the settlement check will be made payable to “Michele Brock and Law Offices of Dedra Brock-Moore, LLC.”

2. **ATTORNEY’S FEES:** This sum is in full settlement and satisfaction of all claims released in this Agreement, including attorneys’ fees and costs. The payment identified in paragraph 1 of this Agreement fully satisfies any obligation which **Defendant** may have to Plaintiff’s attorneys, or any other attorney or law firm that represented **Plaintiff** in connection with this action for attorneys’ fees and costs. Plaintiff acknowledges and agrees that, except as provided herein, (i) no attorney, agent or representative of **Plaintiff** has any claim of any type against **Defendant** or the **Individual Defendant** in connection with the Action or this Agreement, and (ii) each party shall bear his or its own costs, expert’s fees and attorneys’ fees in connection with the Action, the negotiation and execution of this Agreement, the claims released herein, and any matters occurring prior to the date of this Agreement. **Plaintiff** relinquishes any claim(s) for additional attorney’s fees and costs.

3. **NO ADMISSION OF LIABILITY:** Neither this Release nor any of its terms, conditions or provisions constitute an admission of liability or wrongdoing on the part of any of the parties. Neither this Release nor any of its provisions, terms or conditions shall be construed as an admission of liability or wrongdoing or may be offered or received into evidence in any action or proceeding as evidence of an admission of liability or wrongdoing, except in any action to enforce the terms and provisions of this Release.

4. **TAX INDEMNIFICATION:** No representation has been made by **Defendant** as to the appropriate tax treatment of any of the payments it is making to **Plaintiff** on his behalf pursuant to the terms of the Settlement. **Plaintiff** shall be solely responsible for, and promise and agrees to pay, any income or other taxes, interest or penalties owed with respect to the payments referred to in Paragraph 1, and will pay for, and indemnify and hold **Defendant** harmless from and against, any interest, penalties or taxes as a result of **Plaintiff’s** failure to properly report and pay any taxes due on any of the payments.

5. **INDEPENDENT DETERMINATION OF THE PARTIES:** It is further understood and agreed that the undersigned relies wholly upon her judgment, belief, and knowledge of the nature and extent of the claims, expenses and damages allegedly sustained and that this Release is made with reliance upon counsel of the undersigned’s choosing.

6. **INDEMNITY-HOLD HARMLESS:** **Plaintiff** warrants that she is the sole owner of the rights asserted in the Present Lawsuit, and that she has made no assignment of any of these rights. The undersigned further declares that she will hold harmless and indemnify those parties and entities identified in Paragraph 1 of this Release and Settlement Agreement from any and all costs, fees, liabilities and losses which might be incurred by indemnitees as a result of any outstanding liens (medical or otherwise) or rights of reimbursements arising out of the incident alleged in Plaintiff’s Complaint.

7. **DISMISSAL:** Prior to receiving the settlement funds set forth in paragraph 1, **Plaintiff** agrees to first take all actions necessary to dismiss her pending claims against **Defendant** with prejudice, with each Party to bear her or its own costs and attorneys’ fees.

8. **NON-DISPARAGEMENT:** Plaintiff agrees that she will not make any disparaging or derogatory remarks or statements about **Defendant** or the **Individual Defendant** regarding the matter raised in the Lawsuit.

9. **INTEGRATION:** The Parties acknowledge and agree that this Release and Settlement Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties; that the Parties have executed this Release and Settlement Agreement based upon the terms set forth herein; that the Parties have not relied on any prior agreement or representation, whether oral or written, which is not set forth in this Agreement; that no prior agreement, whether oral or written, shall have any effect on the terms and provisions of this Agreement; and that all prior agreements, whether oral or written, are expressly superseded and/or revoked by this Agreement. Each signatory to this agreement warrants and represents that he or she is authorized to sign on behalf of and to bind the party or parties on whose behalf he or she signs.

10. **SEVERABILITY AND WAIVER:** The Parties acknowledge and agree that each provision of this Agreement shall be enforceable independently of every other provision. Furthermore, in the event that any provision is deemed to be unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions shall remain effective, binding and enforceable. The Parties further acknowledge and agree that the failure of any party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver of that provision, or of any other provision of this Agreement.

11. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT:** All the agreements, covenants, representations, and warranties between the parties, expressed or implied, oral or written, concerning the subject matter of this Release are contained in this Release. All prior and contemporaneous conversations, negotiations, agreements, representations, covenants and warranties, concerning the subject matter of this Release, are merged into this Release. This Release may not be modified except by written agreement of all of the parties duly executed by all of the parties. This Release shall be governed by the internal laws of the State of Illinois without regard to conflict of law principles.

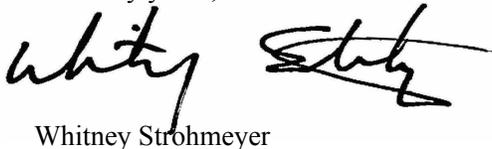

On behalf of the Terminal Railroad Association of St. Louis (TRRA) we are requesting your consideration to submit a letter of support to the Federal Railroad Administration for a Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvement (CRISI) grant application to replace the MacArthur Bridge truss over Broadway Street in St. Louis, Missouri. The MacArthur Bridge main spans and its approaches were constructed between 1906 and 1937 to accommodate vehicle and rail traffic over the Mississippi River between East St. Louis, Illinois and St. Louis, Missouri. The TRRA owns and operates the only two rail bridges over the Mississippi River in the St. Louis region, the MacArthur and Merchants Bridges, as one system to manage rail traffic through the third busiest rail hub in the nation.

The Freight Development Committee and freightway industry leaders along with the Illinois Department of Transportation, Missouri Department of Transportation and the East-West Gateway Council of Governments have identified a priority list of multimodal transportation projects that align economic development with the region's supply chain and have identified several rail projects that include the Merchants Bridge replacement. The proposed MacArthur Bridge project will ensure the dual bridge system to manage rail traffic in the St. Louis region will continue to support the nation's freight network and avoid supply chain disruptions. The CRISI grant program is not in competition with potential funding sources for the Merchants Rail Bridge replacement project. The TRRA has several funding options

under consideration for the Merchants Bridge and we are hopeful this project will advance to construction to avoid further restrictions or closure.

On behalf of \_\_\_\_\_, I am writing to express my support of the Terminal Railroad Association of St. Louis (TRRA) in their 2018 U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvement (CRISI) grant application to replace the MacArthur Bridge truss over Broadway St. in St. Louis, Missouri. The MacArthur Bridge main spans and its approaches were constructed between 1906 and 1937 to accommodate vehicle and rail traffic over the Mississippi River between East St. Louis, Illinois and St. Louis, Missouri.

The TRRA owns and operates the only two rail bridges in the St. Louis region, the MacArthur and Merchants, as one system to manage rail traffic through the third busiest rail hub in the nation. Unfortunately, because of the age of both structures, the system does not operate as efficiently as it could, negatively impacting the movement of goods and passengers riding the Amtrak system.

The St. Louis region is the largest volume rail crossing of the Mississippi River. As an indispensable node in the nation's railroad network, it is critical that these assets are kept in a state of good repair to avoid delays to shippers and carriers who depend on this gateway for safe and efficient service.

By replacing the MacArthur Bridge truss at Broadway Street, the TRRA is using asset management principles to extend its useful life and maintain the structure in a state of good repair for 315,000 pound rolling stock. After the truss is replaced, the bridge will be able to accommodate movement of longer and wider dimensional rail cars, supporting the delivery of these manufactured goods and keeping them off the highway system. The resulting improved clearances will eliminate the need for a 317 mile re-route for dimensional loads.

The federal funds requested to support this effort represent an investment in the St. Louis region and the U.S. economy. The requested funds are consistent with the public benefits associated with the project by helping to lower industry shipping costs. Given the many public and economic benefits associated with this project, we respectfully ask for your consideration of our funding request to support this project.

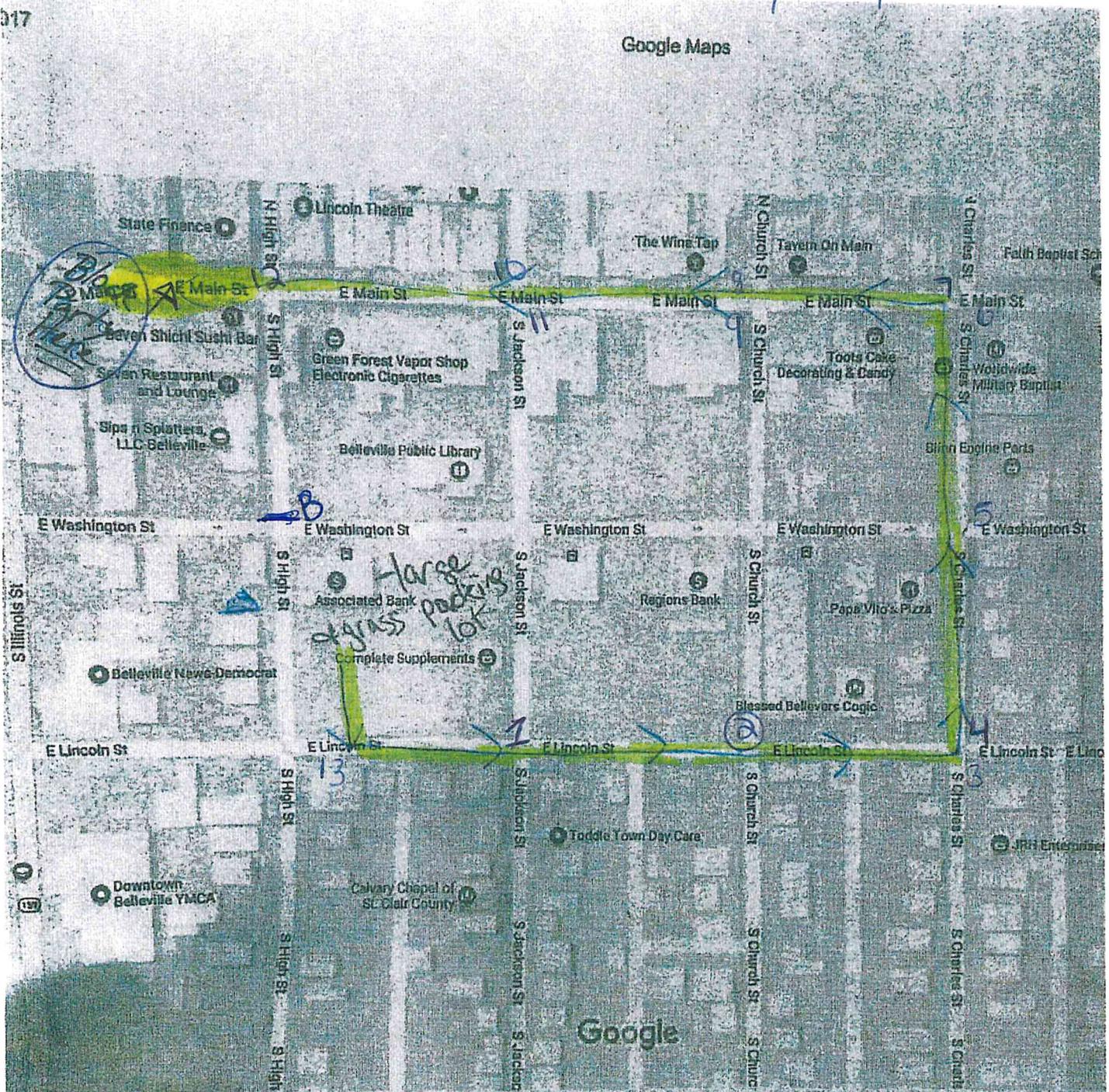

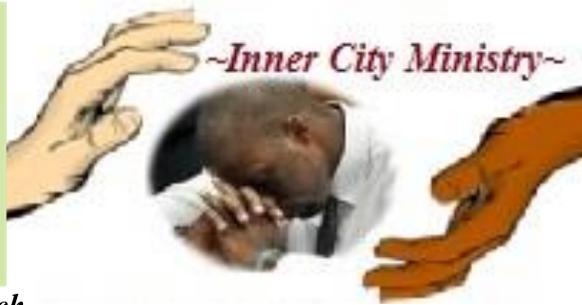

WHEREAS, this **Labor Day Parade** will require the temporary closure of **IL 159 at Public Square**, a State Highway in the City of Belleville on **September 3, 2018 from 10:00 AM to 11:30 AM**;

WHEREAS, Section 4-408 of the Illinois Highway Code authorizes the Department of Transportation to issue permits to local authorities to temporarily close portions of State Highways for such public purposes.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Belleville that permission to close off **IL 159 at Public Square** on **September 3, 2018 from 10:00 AM to 11:30 AM** as above designated, be requested of the Department of Transportation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this closure shall occur during the approximate time period between **September 3, 2018 from 10:00 AM to 11:30 AM**.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that traffic from that closed portion of highway shall be detoured over routes with an all-weather surface that can accept the anticipated traffic, which will be maintained to the satisfaction of the Department and which is conspicuously marked for the benefit of traffic diverted from the State highway. (The parking of vehicles shall be prohibited on the detour routes to allow an uninterrupted flow of two-way traffic.)\* The detour route shall be as follows:

\* To be used when appropriate.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the **City of Belleville** assumes full responsibility for the direction, protection, and regulation of the traffic during the time the detour is in effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that police officers or authorized flaggers shall at the expense of the **City of Belleville** be positioned at each end of the closed section and at other points (such as intersections) as may be necessary to assist in directing traffic through the detour.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that police officers, flaggers, and officials shall permit emergency vehicles in emergency situations to pass through the closed area as swiftly as is safe for all concerned.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all debris shall be removed by the **City of Belleville** prior to reopening the State highway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such signs, flags, barricades, etc., shall be used by the **City of Belleville** as may be approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation. These items shall be provided by the **City of Belleville**.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the closure and detour shall be marked according to the Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that an occasional break shall be made in the procession so that traffic may pass through. In any event, adequate provisions will be made for traffic on intersecting highways pursuant to conditions noted above. (Note: This paragraph is applicable when the Resolution pertains to a Parade or when no detour is required.)

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that to the fullest extent permitted by law, the **Southwestern Illinois Central Labor Council AFL-CIO** shall be responsible for any and all injuries to persons or damages to property, and shall indemnify and hold harmless the Illinois Department of Transportation, its officers, employees and agents from any and all claims, lawsuits, actions, costs and fees (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses) of every nature or description, arising out of, resulting from or connected with the exercise of authority granted by the Department which is the subject of this resolution. The obligation is binding upon the **Southwestern Illinois Central Labor Council AFL-CIO** regardless of whether or not such claim, damage, loss or expense is caused in part by the act, omission or negligence of the Department or its officers, employees or agents.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the **Southwestern Illinois Central Labor Council AFL-CIO** shall provide a comprehensive general liability policy or an additional named insured endorsement in the minimum amount of **\$1,000,000 per person and \$2,000,000 aggregate** which has the Illinois Department of Transportation, its officials, employees and agents as insured's and which protects them from all claims arising from the requested road closing. A copy of said policy or endorsement will be provided to the Department before the road is closed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Illinois Department of Transportation, District 8, to serve as a formal request for the permission sought in this resolution and to operate as part of the conditions of said permission.
