MAYOR'S MESSAGE

The first nine months of 2018 have passed by quickly. Now we prepare for one of the busiest three months of any year!

October 5th and 6th are the dates for this year's 35th Annual Chili Cook-Off. This event is always a great time in downtown Belleville! We hope you join us for another outstanding patriotic tribute for our Veterans at the 20th Annual Veterans Day Ceremony on November 11th at 11:00 a.m. on the Public Square. Let's have the largest attendance ever! Belleville hosts the largest Christmas parade in southern Illinois on the day after Thanksgiving. This date also marks our month-long activities on the Public Square, including the Christkindlmarkt, Santa on the Square, horse-drawn trolley rides and so much more for families to enjoy.

A number of projects will meet completion in the last quarter of the year. East 'A' Street from North Illinois Street to Oak Street will have new sidewalks, curbs, and street overlay. South 27th Street improvements will be completed from West Main Street to the end of Union School's property, with the remainder of South 27th Street upgrades scheduled for next year. West 'A' Street upgrades will be complete from North 20th Street to North 23rd Street and Union Avenue from Centreville Avenue to 8th Street. Also,

Westfield Plaza Drive will receive an asphalt overlay on the city's section of the roadway that goes back to Westfield Manor and at the entrance to the Westfield Plaza McDonald's, where the owners just reinvested in their business with a complete remodel.

Thank you to all who participated in the Moment of Remembrance Ceremony and Dedication of Phase 3 of the September 11 Memorial Walkway of Southern Illinois, including our guest speaker, Colonel Lillard D. Evans, Deputy Commander, Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command of Scott Air Force Base, and members of the September 11 Memorial Walkway Committee.

Once again, Belleville citizens volunteered on September 15th for Belleville Helping Belleville; a one day event sponsored by The BASIC Initiative in which volunteers take on projects to help those in need. Great things continue to happen when so many caring people work together.

I hope you enjoy all the season has to offer and make some family memories with all of our scheduled holiday activities! Thank you for supporting our local businesses in the past and throughout this holiday season. Remember, when you "Buy Belleville", you are supporting essential city services.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION SCHEDULE

For October – December of 2018: Yard waste will continue to be collected weekly through Friday, December 14, 2018, weather permitting. It will not be collected again until the week of January 14-18, 2019.

For January – December of 2019: During the months of January and February, yard waste is only collected during the 2nd full week of each month (a full week is considered to be Monday – Friday).

- January 2019 - Yard Waste will only be collected **January 14-18**
- February 2019 - Yard Waste will only be collected **February 11-15**
- March – December 2019 - Weekly collection will resume during the 1st

full week of March and will continue through the 2nd full week of December, specifically **March 4, 2019 - December 13, 2019**, weather permitting.

After December 13, 2019, there will be no yard waste collection until the 2nd full week of January, 2020.

DISPOSAL OF LEAVES AND GRASS CLIPPINGS

Belleville's City Code of Ordinances provides regulations regarding the disposal of grass clippings and leaves into City streets. Debris of any kind, including leaves and grass clippings, should not be placed, thrown, or blown into the street, ditches, culverts, or upon the banks or sides of any stream, creek, lake, or any other flowing watercourse. Doing so can impede the flow of water, causing backups that may result in major damage due to flooding of streets or homes.

The Sanitation Department provides yard waste collection for all residents with City sanitation services. For questions about yard waste collection, please see the article on page 1, or call the Sanitation office at 618-233-6816.

SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES

The City's Street Department tries to ensure that streets remain clear of ice and snow. Businesses and residents are asked to do their part as well, and to be aware of factors affecting snow removal.

- Streets marked as Snow Routes need to be kept free of parked cars during inclement weather. When a significant accumulation of snow and ice is forecast, cars should be removed from all public streets so the city's snow and ice removal vehicles can maneuver safely. In places where no other parking is available, residents are asked to park on one side of the street. Snow plows require an open path with a minimum width of 12 feet to maneuver safely and effectively.
- Snow should not be transferred to the roadways from private property. This includes snow from parking lots and residential driveways.
- Designated Snow Routes & Primary Routes will be cleared first. These routes include streets leading to hospitals, fire houses, the court house, and the county jail.
- Streets surrounding and leading to schools must be cleared for safety. If schools are cancelled, or inclement weather falls on weekends or holidays, these streets will be cleared in rotation for that region. Residential streets and subdivisions are cleared using a grid pattern.

6TH - 12TH STREET SEWER SEPARATION

Work began on the 6th-12th Street Sewer Separation project on September 10, 2018. The work consists of separating the storm water off the sanitary system. The storm water will flow straight into Richland Creek. This work is necessary to relieve our sewer plant from treating unnecessary storm water.

The sewer separation work will start at Richland Creek near 6th Street and proceed west to 12th Street. The work is anticipated to be completed during the 2018 construction season, weather dependant. Once the sewer separation is completed, the city will move into the 6th-12th Street Streetscape phase. This streetscape project is a continuation of what we were able to accomplish downtown. This work is anticipated to start in Spring, 2019 and be completed during the 2019 construction season. The final phase will be the 12th-17th Street Streetscape. This work is anticipated to start Spring, 2020 and be completed by November, 2020.

The Streetscape will consist of new curbs, driveways, wider sidewalks, and decorative light poles along with a new roadway surface. This project will require lane closures and sometimes full street closures. We ask the motoring public to use the designated detours when possible. For the safety of the public and workers, the contractor plans to have the sewer separation area from 6th-12th Street closed except for local traffic.

All businesses will be open for the duration of this work. Please keep the local businesses in mind while we complete this improvement.

GENERAL AND COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE OFFICE RENOVATION

More great news! Construction is underway at the office of General and Community Assistance. The remodel will provide an entrance, counter, and restroom with accessibility to individuals utilizing wheelchairs. The wall of windows on the west side of the building will be removed and replaced with a traditional exterior wall with energy efficient windows. These improvements will enhance the office's ability to provide services to those in need and to safely maintain records.

During the construction project, the office staff will operate from the Sanitation office area at 512 West Main Street. Door signs will be posted to provide clarity. Office hours will remain Monday-Thursday, 8:30 AM to noon and 12:30 - 4 PM. It is expected the project will be completed in October.

General and Community Assistance provides limited financial assistance to Belleville residents receiving incomes less than \$245 per month with no other forms of assistance, aside from SNAP. Additionally, the office assists with community referrals, job readiness, and job searches.




