### **ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & ANNEXATION COMMITTEE**

*Discussion...*

Alderman Randle stated at the August 20, 2018 City Council meeting he voted no on the proposal to give tax dollars to a local business so it could demolish a building they did not yet own for the purpose of expanding its current location. One of his colleagues on city council approached him after that meeting to inquire for his reasons opposing the request. Alderman Randle said he laid out his reasons for voting no. That said business does not generate sales tax which means there is no return on that \$50,000 investment by the city. As he drove home from the meeting, he thought about the alderman's questions and wondered if he did a disservice to the other aldermen, the constituents of Ward 3 and the taxpayers in this city who do not have a reference point for his decision.

Reasons for voting no...

The Tax Increment Allocation Act for TIF provides for a number of different uses and too many to include here. When he prioritized he found the infrastructure to be the driving force for using TIF dollars. Repairing our streets, curbs and sidewalks has huge impact. It touches everything from sustaining property values to improving public safety.

This is a driving force for people reinvesting in their homes. That is the primary mission. When we entertain other idea, when we seek to deviate from that mission there need to be overwhelming evidence that the economic interest of the city will be served by sales tax dollars generated as a result in the taxpayer investment. That is not the case with these two requests. He believes that when TIFs are created they are designed to be self-sustaining and he believes they should be held to that standard. That means the money from any expenditure by that TIF should come from the revenue generated within that TIF. In other words, he doesn't use his neighbors money to make repairs to his home.

According to the treasurer's report from the city council meeting of November 5, 2018 as of September 30, 2018 TIF 17 had cash on deposit balance \$34,388.38. The current tax year levy was \$7,313.60 with interest income of \$12.98 for a total receipts of \$7,326.58. The total cash available of \$45,533.38. It should be noted that total disbursements for other improvements totaled expenses of \$9,195.00. We are spending more than the TIF takes in. But, when asked, why we could not draw on the current balance of \$34,388.38 for these requests it's because the money is already committed.

The two development agreement be presented tonight are \$5,000/ea coming out of TIF 17 funds. It does not detail these funds must be transferred from TIF 3 in order for the funds to be available. What that means is those that paid in to TIF 3 will forgo the use of those tax dollars within their districts. Arguments were made that \$5,000 would not go far to resurface a street.

He agrees; however, he finds such argument to be rationalizing a decision to remove money from one district where there are taxpayers waiting on improvements to benefit another who has not made such sacrifice. Once again, we are robbing Peter to pay Paul. The cumulative effect of taking \$5,000.00 here and \$5,000.00 there all of a sudden is \$10,000.00 and he can point to a lot of sidewalks that could be replaced and made safer if that money stayed in TIF 3.

A realty company generates \$0 sales tax. \$0 return to the general fund. The photography business generates 1/10 of the normal sales tax rate. For every \$1,000.00 in sales results in tax amounts of \$6.71 and what comes back to the city is pennies of that amount. Dollars spent helping non-revenue producing entities occupying buildings downtown are dollars not spent somewhere else where they are sorely needed. We should be using this money to make repairs i.e. fixing sidewalks in front of someone's home that will benefit from the added safety.

If we truly cared about our neighbors and taxpayers that is where our focus should be. That is the principle he employs and the reasons he is voting no.

With respect to transferring money from TIF3 to TIF 17...just because you can do something doesn't mean you should. It would be different if this were a major project crossing TIF district lines but that is just not the case. In this instance, the business owner should burden the cost...not the taxpayer.

Mayor Eckert stated the money has been earmarked for facade improvements from TIF 3. The owners will be putting \$80,000.00 - \$100,000.00 in investments.

The following Special Provisions supplement the "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction," adopted April 1, 2016, the latest edition of the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways," and the "Manual of Test Procedures for Materials" in effect on the date of invitation for bids, and the Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions indicated on the Check Sheet included herein which apply to and govern the construction of FAU Route 9257 (North Belt West); Section (28-1, 122-1, 122-2) SW-1; St. Clair County; Contract No. 76J81 and in case of conflict with any part or parts of said Specifications, the said Special Provisions shall take precedence and shall govern.

#### LOCATION OF PROJECT

The location is on North Belt West from Frank Scott Parkway to 17<sup>th</sup> Street in Belleville

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

This proposed work involves constructing sidewalk ADA accessible ramps. Items of work include: Portland Cement Concrete Sidewalk 4"; Detectable Warnings; Combination Curb & Gutter Removal; Sidewalk Removal; Concrete Median Surface Removal; Remove Existing Handhole; Handhole PCC, Pedestrian Push Button, Manholes to be Adjusted; Combination Curb & Gutter; Concrete Median Surface; Thermoplastic Pavement Markings; Pavement Marking Removal Water Blasting; Traffic Control and all necessary and collateral work to complete the contract.

#### SUBMITTAL OF EEO/LABOR DOCUMENTATION

Effective: April 2016

This work shall be done in accordance with Check Sheets No. 1, 3 and 5 of the IDOT Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions and the "Weekly DBE Trucking Reports (BDE)" Special Provision, except as here-in modified.

#### PAYROLL AND STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE:

Certified payroll, (FORM SBE 48 OR AN APPROVED FACSIMILE) and the Statement of Compliance, (FORM SBE 348) shall be submitted by two methods:

1. By Mail (United States Postal Service): The ORIGINAL of the certified payroll and the Statement of Compliance for the Prime Contractor and each Subcontractor shall be submitted by mail to the Regional Engineer for District 8.
2. Electronically: Scan both the ORIGINAL of the certified payroll and the Statement of Compliance to the same PDF file and email to the District at the email address designated by the District EEO Officer.

SBE 48 and SBE 348 forms shall be submitted weekly and will be considered late if received after midnight seven (7) business days after the payroll ending date.

WEEKLY DBE TRUCKING REPORT:

The Weekly DBE Trucking Report, (FORM SBE 723) shall be submitted electronically. Scan the form to a PDF file and email to the District at the email address designated by the District EEO Officer.

SBE 723 forms shall be submitted weekly and will be considered late if received after midnight ten (10) business days following the reporting period.

MONTHLY LABOR SUMMARY & MONTHLY CONTRACT ACTIVITY REPORTS:

The Monthly Labor Summary Report (MLSR) shall be submitted by one of two methods:

1. For contractors having IDOT contracts valued in the aggregate at \$250,000 or less, the report may be typed or clearly handwritten using Form D8 PI0148. Submit the ORIGINAL report by mail to the Regional Engineer for District Eight. Contractors also have the option of using the method #2 outlined below.
2. For contractors having IDOT contracts valued in the aggregate at more than \$250,000, the report must be submitted in a specific "Fixed Length Comma Delimited ASCII Text File Format". This file shall be submitted by e-mail using specific file formatting criteria provided by the District EEO Officer. Contractors must submit a sample text file to District 8 for review at least fourteen (14) days prior to the start of construction.

The Monthly Contract Activity Report (MCAR) may be typed or clearly handwritten using Form D8 PI0149.

The Monthly Labor Summary Report and the Monthly Contract Activity Report shall be submitted concurrently. If the method of transmittal is method #1 above then both the MLSR and the MCAR shall be mailed together in the same envelope. If the method of transmittal is method #2 above then the MCAR shall be scanned to a .pdf file and attached to the email containing the MLSR .txt file.

The MLSR and MCAR must be submitted for each consecutive month, for the duration of the project, and will be considered late if received after midnight ten (10) calendar days following the reporting period.

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF SUBCONTRACTOR:

The ORIGINAL and one copy of the Request for Approval of Subcontractor (FORM BC 260A) shall be submitted to the District at the IDOT Preconstruction Conference.

SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAM CERTIFICATION:

The ORIGINAL and one copy of the Substance Abuse Prevention Program Certification (FORM BC 261) shall be submitted to the District at the IDOT Preconstruction Conference.

The Contractor is required to follow submittal procedures as provided by the EEO Officer at the preconstruction conference and to follow all revisions to those procedures as issued thereafter.

If a report is rejected, it is the contractor's responsibility to make required adjustments and/or corrections and resubmit the report. Reports not submitted and accepted within the established timeframes will be considered late.

Disclosure of this information is necessary to accomplish the statutory purpose as outlined under 23CFR part 230 and 41CFR part 60.4 and the Illinois Human Rights Act. Disclosure of this information is REQUIRED. **Failure to comply with this special provision may result in the withholding of payments to the contractor, and/or cancellation, termination, or suspension of the contract in whole or part.**

**This Special Provision must be included in each subcontract agreement.**

Compliance with this Special Provision shall be included in the cost of the contract and no additional compensation will be allowed for any costs incurred.

## **DETECTOR LOOP REPLACEMENT**

This work shall consist of furnishing and installing a detector loop, of the type specified in the plans, in the pavement in conformance with the requirements of the plans, Sections 873 & 886 of the Standard Specifications, and Standards 886001 and 886006, with the following exceptions:

Replace the third paragraph of Article 886.04(a) with the following:

The loop wire shall be held tightly in the bottom of the sawed slot by means of a plastic foam type material. The "backer rod" shall completely cover the wire and provide a barrier between the wire and the sealant. The loop wires not imbedded in the pavement shall be evenly twisted approximately 5 turns per foot. The depth of the sawed slot shall be as required to provide a minimum of one inch clearance between the surface of the pavement and the top of the backer rod. When loops are placed in the binder or base course of bituminous pavement and will be covered by an additional surface course, the clearance may be reduced to one-half inch.

Each detector loop lead-in shall be installed in a separate conduit as shown in the plans. This conduit extends from the edge of the pavement to the nearest handhole.

At all locations where pavement joints that are not doweled or pavement separation cracks (including areas where bituminous pavement abuts concrete pavement) are encountered by the slots sawed for the placement of the detector loops or lead-ins, a cored expansion hole shall be made per Standard 886001. The cored expansion holes are included in this pay item and no additional compensation will be made. The location of all detector loops and number of turns shall be approved by the Engineer before any slots are sawed in the pavement.

After rotomilling the Engineer shall contact Bureau of Operations of I.D.O.T. to determine if the existing loop is operational. If the loop is damaged it shall be re-cut, reconnected, and fully operational within five (5) working days. Detector loops shall be placed in the pavement after milling and prior to resurfacing.

Detector loops shall be spliced into the existing lead-in cables in the handhole. The splices shall be made per Section 873 of the Standard Specifications. Conductors shall be spliced in a rigid mold. Rosin-core solder shall be used. The cost of labor and material for removing existing detector loop cables from the conduit and splicing into the existing lead-in cables shall be included in the pay item DETECTOR LOOP REPLACEMENT.

Locating underground cables will be paid for separately.

This work will be paid for at the contract unit price per foot for DETECTOR LOOP REPLACEMENT, measured along the sawed slot in the pavement containing the loops and lead in, rather than the actual length of wire in the slot, which price shall be payment in full for furnishing, installing and testing the detector loop complete in place.

This work shall be done according to Section 1106 of the Standard Specifications and Highway Standard 701901 except as herein modified.

All construction signs mounted on permanent support for use in temporary traffic control having an area of 10 square feet (1 square meter) or more shall be mounted on two 4 in x 4 in (100 mm x 100 mm) or two 4 in x 6 in (100 mm x 150 mm) wood posts.

Type A metal post, two for each sign, conforming to Article 1006.29 of the Standard Specifications may be used in lieu of wood posts. Type A metal posts used for these signs may be unfinished.

This work shall not be paid for separately; but shall be considered included in the cost of the traffic control items in this contract.

and regulatory pedestrian instruction sign according to MUTCD sign series R10-1 through R10-4.

The bracket shall be machined from 6061 T6 Al, have powder coated color to match the existing traffic signal structure and have stainless steel mounting hardware.

Dear Mayor Eckert:

The State of Illinois, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, in cooperation with the City of Belleville, in order to facilitate access for pedestrian traffic, is desirous of improving FAU Route 9257 (North Belt West) between 17<sup>th</sup> Street and Frank Scott Parkway. The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires transition plans for state and local governments to plan and implement a process for removal of accessibility barriers. In following with this transition plan, the sidewalk curb ramps for crosswalks crossing North Belt West will be made ADA compliant. Other work along North Belt West will include replacing ADA push buttons and crosswalk signals, and performing all other work necessary to complete this improvement according to the approved plans and specifications, to be known as Section (28-1,122-1,122-2)SW-1.

In order to advance the improvement, which is desired and which will be of immediate benefit to the residents of Belleville, as well as the traveling public, it is necessary that the City of Belleville and the State agree as to the responsibilities of each party. This letter and the acceptance thereof by the City of Belleville shall constitute such agreement. These responsibilities are as follows:

1. The STATE agrees to make the surveys, prepare plans and specifications, receive bids and award the contract; furnish engineering inspection during construction and cause the improvement to be built in accordance with the plans, specifications, and contract; and pay all the costs incidental thereto.
2. The estimated cost of the improvement is \$365,000.

3. The City of Belleville agrees to allow the STATE, its Representatives and Contractors, to enter upon City of Belleville right-of-way or easements to perform construction and maintenance without compensation other than the completion of the proposed improvements.
4. The City of Belleville shall exercise its franchise rights to cause private utilities to be relocated, if required, at no expense to the STATE.
5. Upon completion of the improvement and as long as FAU Route 9257 (North Belt West) is used as a State Highway, the STATE agrees to continue to maintain those portions of FAU Route 9257 (North Belt West) previously maintained by the STATE.
6. Upon completion of the improvement, the City of Belleville agrees to continue to maintain, or cause to be maintained, those portions of FAU Route 9257 (North Belt West), within the City of Belleville, not maintained by the STATE, including all City of Belleville streets and alleys outside the edge of pavement of FAU Route 9257 (North Belt West), traffic signals, sidewalk, and the ADA curb ramps and crosswalks.
7. The City of Belleville agrees to provide, prior to the State's advertising for work to be performed hereunder, approval of the plans and specifications as prepared, by letter or Resolution.
8. It is mutually agreed that the covenants contained herein shall become null and void in the event a contract covering construction work contemplated herein is not awarded within three years subsequent to execution of this agreement.
9. It is mutually agreed that this Letter of Understanding shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.

**ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_**

**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING SALE/CONVERSION OF PERSONAL PROPERTY**

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE "CITY"), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

WHEREAS, the City of Belleville, Illinois ("City") owns personal property in the forms identified in Exhibit A attached hereto ("Property"), that it finds to be no longer necessary or useful to the City;

WHEREAS, Section 11-76-4 of the Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/11-76-4) pertinently empowers this City Council to sell personal property that is no longer necessary or useful to, or for the best interests of the City, in such a manner as this City Council may designate, with or without advertising the sale, or to convert that personal property into some other form that is useful to the City by using the material in the personal property;

WHEREAS, in the best interests of the City and upon the recommendation of its Administration, this City Council desires to authorize the charitable transfer, scrap, discard or auction of the property in accordance with applicable law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

**Section 1.** This City Council does hereby authorize and direct its Administration to charitably transfer, scrap, discard or auction the property in accordance with applicable law.

**Section 2.** This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication all as provided by law.
