



Instructions to Applicant

1. The law provides that territory contiguous to a Municipality may be annexed upon petition signed by ALL the owners of such land and ALL the voters residing thereon. Such annexation is initiated by the filing of a written petition signed by said owners of record and said voters residing thereon. It is absolutely necessary that ALL the owners and ALL the voters sign this petition if annexation is to be accomplished in this manner.
2. A Warranty Deed containing a complete legal description for each parcel of land sought to be annexed by the petition should be included. When filing out the petition on the reverse side, the names of all the owners and their respective spouses, if any, the names of the voters should be inserted in the spaces provided therefore.
3. If the territory sought to be annexed is part of any Fire Protection District, the trustees of that District will be notified in writing by certified or registered mail of the petition to annex by city staff.
4. The complete legal description for each parcel of land sought to be annexed by this petition should be set out in the space provided on the reverse side, specifying the ownership of each parcel of land so described.
5. All those persons signing the petition must do so before a Notary Public, and their names should be filled in the space provided on the reverse side for the Jurat of such Notary Public.
6. After the signing and notarization of this petition, it should be delivered or sent to the Residential & Commercial Development Services, 407 E. Lincoln St., Belleville, Illinois, 62220 along with four (4) copies of the plats of the area to be annexed, bearing a Land Surveyor's Seal. This seal is mandatory by reason of the Statutory provisions relating to the recording of plats and maps. 





- Part 1 Scope/Compensation/Term
- Part 2 General Provisions
- Part 3 Specific Provisions
- Part 4 Scope of Services/Responsibilities
- Part 5 Compensation of Services

Part 1 - Scope/Compensation/Term

- A. Scope of Services and Responsibilities.** The CITY OF BELLEVILLE and SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT agree as specified in Part 4.
- B. Compensation.** Compensation shall be as specified in Part 5.
- C. Term of Agreement.** The term of this Agreement shall be from **May 1, 2019 to April 30, 2021.**
- D. Amendments.** All changes to this Agreement must be mutually agreed upon by the CITY OF BELLEVILLE and SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT and be incorporated by written amendment, signed by the parties.
- E. Renewal.** This Agreement may not be renewed.

Part 2 – General Provisions

- A. Changes.** If any circumstance or condition in the Agreement changes, SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT must notify the CITY OF BELLEVILLE in writing within seven days.
- B. Compliance/Governing Law.** Any obligations and services performed under this Agreement shall be performed in compliance with applicable state and federal laws.

C. Availability of Appropriation. This Agreement is contingent upon and subject to the availability of funds. The CITY OF BELLEVILLE, at its sole option, may terminate or suspend the Agreement, in whole or in part, without penalty or further payment being required, if (1) the Illinois General Assembly or the federal funding source fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such obligation, or if funds needed are insufficient for any reason, (2) the Governor decreases the CITY OF BELLEVILLE's funding by reserving some or all of the CITY OF BELLEVILLE's appropriation(s) pursuant to power delegated to the Governor by the Illinois General Assembly; or (3) the CITY OF BELLEVILLE determines, in its sole discretion or as directed by the Mayor of Belleville, that a reduction is necessary or advisable based upon actual or projected budgetary considerations. SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT will be notified in writing of the failure of appropriation or of a reduction or decrease.

Part 3 – Specific Provisions

A. Reports. Annual reports submitted by SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT will be based on the approved quarterly lump sum amount for completion of Part 4, Scope of Services and as described in Part 5, Compensation for Services. Furthermore, if any of the deliverables in Part 4 are not satisfactorily completed as determined by the CITY OF BELLEVILLE, the CITY OF BELLEVILLE will advise the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT of the deficiencies to be corrected before invoicing will be authorized.

Annual reports issued by the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT to the CITY OF BELLEVILLE pursuant to this Agreement shall be sent to the following address:

All annual reports shall be signed by an authorized representative of the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT.

B. Billing and Payment. The CITY OF BELLEVILLE will make quarterly payments according to Section 5B of this agreement. The SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT shall provide proof of all work performed on an annual basis no later than May 31st of each year. The CITY OF BELLEVILLE will direct all payments to the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT's remittance address listed in this Agreement.

C. Termination. If the CITY OF BELLEVILLE is dissatisfied with the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT's performance or believes that there has been a substantial decrease in the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT's performance, the CITY OF BELLEVILLE may give written notice that remedial action shall be taken by the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT within seven (7) calendar days. If

such action is not taken within the time afforded, the CITY OF BELLEVILLE may terminate the Agreement by giving seven (7) days written notice to the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT. Additionally, the CITY OF BELLEVILLE or the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT may terminate the Agreement by giving the other party ninety (90) days written notice.

In either instance, the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT shall be paid for the value of all authorized and acceptable work performed prior to the date of termination, based upon the payment terms set forth in the Agreement.

- D. **Location of Service.** Service to be performed by the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT shall be performed as described in Part 4.
- E. **Reporting/Consultation.** The SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT shall consult with and keep the CITY OF BELLEVILLE fully informed as to the progress of all matters covered by this Agreement.
- F. **Indemnification.** Unless prohibited by State law, the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the CITY OF BELLEVILLE, and its officials, employees, and agents, from any and all losses, expenses, damages (including loss of use), suits, demands and claims, and shall defend any suit or action, whether at law or in equity, based on any alleged injury or damage of any type arising from the actions or inactions of the SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT's employees, officials, agents, contractors and subcontractors, and shall pay all damages, judgements, costs, expenses, and fees, including attorney's fees, incurred by the CITY OF BELLEVILLE and its officials, employees and agents in connection therewith.

SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT shall defend, indemnify and hold the CITY OF BELLEVILLE harmless against a third-party action, suit or proceeding ("Claim") against the CITY OF BELLEVILLE to the extent such Claim is based upon an allegation that a Product, as of its delivery date under this Agreement, infringes a valid United States patent or copyright or misappropriates a third party's trade secret.

Public Liability Insurance. The parties shall each carry public liability insurance in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000.00 per person, per occurrence, and such policies shall name the other party as an additional insured for the terms performed pursuant to the Agreement. Both Parties shall provide each other with copies of their certificates of insurance policies so stating.

- G. **Equal Employment Opportunities, Affirmative Action, Sexual Harassment.** SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT will comply with the Illinois Human Rights Act with respect to public contracts, including equal employment opportunity, refraining from unlawful discrimination and having a written sexual harassment policy.

- All other routine operational services.

C. Responsibilities. The SMITHTON TOWNSHIP ROAD DISTRICT agrees to the following:

- The CITY OF BELLEVILLE will be responsible for all maintenance and repair for structure # 082-4126 over Richland Creek and any culverts on city right-of-way.
- Must undertake all measures, including notifying the CITY OF BELLEVILLE of the need for legal action, to require utility owners or permit holders to adjust, maintain, repair, and restore all pavement cuts, curb openings, utility frames, municipal frames, grates, and covers that are disturbed by settlement, construction, or repair;
- Must notify the CITY OF BELLEVILLE of the need to inform utility owners or permit holders to pay all costs of adjustment, maintenance, repair and restoration;
- Must ensure that the work adheres to all applicable laws, rules and regulations, as well as the CITY OF BELLEVILLE's standards (the most recent edition of Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, and subsequent updates); and
- Must request and obtain written approval from the CITY OF BELLEVILLE's City Engineer or his designee before doing any extra work not specifically identified in the Agreement.

Re: Quality Based Selection (QBS) Policy & Procedure

The City of Belleville regularly receives federal funds, which may be used to fund the engineering and design related consultant services. Our written policies and procedures as described herein for Quality Based Selection (QBS) will meet the requirements of 23 CFR 172 and the Brooks Act.

1. Initial Administration – The City of Belleville's QBS policy and procedures assigns responsibilities to either the City Engineer, Finance Director or Staff Engineers within the City of Belleville organization for the procurement, management, and administration for consultant services.
2. Written Policies and Procedures – The City of Belleville believes their adopted QBS written policies and procedures substantially follows Section 5-5 of the *BLRS Manual* and specifically Section 5-5.06(e), therefore; approval from IDOT is not required.
3. Project Description - The City of Belleville will use the following five items when developing the project description and may include additional items when unique circumstances exist.
 - Describe in general terms the need, purpose, and objective of the project;
 - Identify the various project components;
 - Establish the desired timetable for the effort;
 - Identify any expected problems
 - Determine the total project budget.

4. Public Notice – The City of Belleville will post an announcement on our website, belleville.net, and/or publish an ad in a newspaper with appropriate circulation. The item will be advertised for at least 14 days prior to the acceptance of proposals, and at least twice in the newspaper and/or on continuous display on our website.
5. Conflict of Interest – The City of Belleville requires consultants to submit a disclosure statement with their procedures. The City of Belleville requires the use of the IDOT BDE DISC 2 Template as their conflict of interest form.
6. Suspension and Debarment - The City of Belleville will use SAM Exclusions, IDOT's CPO's website and the three (3) other state CPO's websites to verify suspensions and debarments actions to ensure the eligibility of firms short listed and selected for projects.
7. Evaluation Factors – The City of Belleville allows the City Engineer to set the evaluation factors for each project, but must include a minimum of four (4) criterion and stay within the established weighting range as indicated below. The maximum of DBE and local presence combined will not be more than 10% on projects where federal funds are used. Project specific evaluation factors will be included at a minimum in the Request for Proposals.

8. Selection – The City of Belleville require a three (3) person selection committee. Typically the selection committee members include City Engineer, Director of Public Works, Finance Director or Staff Engineers. The selection committee members must certify that they do not have a conflict of interest. Selection committee members are chosen by the City Engineer for each project. The City of Belleville requires each member of the selection committee to provide an independent score for each proposal using the form below prior to the selection committee meeting.

Rating is a 1-5 scale: 1-Poor; 2-Below Average; 3-Average; 4-Above Average; 5-Excellent

The selection committee members' scores are averaged for a committee score which is used to establish a short list of three (3) firms. The committee score is adjusted by the committee based on

group discussion and information gained from presentations and interviews to develop a final ranking. If there are other firms within 10% of the minimum score, the City Engineer may choose to expand the short list to include more than three (3) firms.

9. Independent Estimate – The City of Belleville will prepare an independent in-house estimate for the project prior to contract negotiation. The estimate will be used in the negotiation.
10. Contract Negotiation – The City of Belleville requires a two (2) person team to negotiate with firms. The team consists of any combination of the City Engineer, Finance Director or Staff Engineers. Members of the negotiation team may not delegate this responsibility to staff members.
11. Acceptable Costs – The City of Belleville require the City Engineer or Staff to review the contract costs and the indirect cost rates to assure they are compliant with Federal cost principles prior to submission to IDOT for reimbursement.
12. Invoice Processing – The City of Belleville requires the City Engineer or Staff assigned to any project using federal funds to review and approve all invoices prior to payment and submission to IDOT for reimbursement.
13. Project Administration – The City of Belleville requires the assigned Staff to monitor work on the project in accordance with the contract and to file reports with the City Engineer. The City of Belleville will evaluate the consultants work at the end of each project. These reports are maintained in the City Engineer's office. The City of Belleville follows IDOT's requirements and the required submission of the BLRS Form 05613 to the IDOT District at contract close-out along with the final invoice.



Belleville Fire Department Regulations for the Downtown Events

- Each vendor with an open flame is required to have a **CURRENT (SERVICED AND TAGGED WITHIN THE LAST 12 MONTHS)** fire extinguisher at their booth for emergencies. In addition, for vendors who deep fry, the Belleville Fire Department requires a "K" fire extinguisher for oils and greases. For all cooking vendors, the **4A40BC** fire extinguisher or larger is required if you have an open flame. A **4A40BC** fire extinguisher can be accomplished with two extinguishers with a total of 4A40BC. (i.e. 2each 2A20BC)
- No Generators allowed
- If using a propane tank, the tank must be secured. The smaller 20lb tanks can be in a milk crate secured with bungee cords, but larger tanks need to be secured with a light weight chain, not bungee cords.
- Electrical – The Fire Chief requires vendors to use the 10 ga extension cords (can find at hardware supply stores). 50 foot cords are sufficient. Vendors must have a separate extension cord for each circuit. This is for your safety and that of your fellow vendors.
- If rain is forecast, keep all extension cords out of the gutters and standing water.
- Watch for trip hazards around your stand.
- **All** tents must be secured on all corners, sandbags or another source weight must be attached. (sandbags, water barrels, concrete tubes etc.)
- Sidewalks behind exhibitor space must have 48" open walkway for Emergency and ADA access.

This City Council hereby authorizes, empowers and directs the Mayor to execute on its behalf the Loan documents and any addenda, schedule, notes, UCC financing statements or other instruments issued under the provision of the Loan dated on or about March 25, 2019 with Bank of Belleville in the amount of Four Hundred Twenty Three Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty Nine Dollars and Ninety Eight Cents (\$423,989.98), payable over a period of no more than three (3) years at 2.63% annual interest rate, subject to a lien on the Sanitation Trucks as collateral for the Loan, and any other instrument or document which may be necessary or expedient in connection with agreement upon or fulfillment of the provisions of the Loan.

Section 2. Pursuant to Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, this Loan be and hereby is designated a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" includable within the ten million dollars (\$10,000,000) of the aggregate issues designated as "qualified tax-exempt obligations" for the calendar year within which this Loan is entered into.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 33 (PUBLIC SAFETY;
LAW ENFORCEMENT) OF THE REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES OF
THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS BY ADDING SECTION 33.107**

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE "CITY"), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. AMENDMENT. Chapter 33 (Public Safety; Law Enforcement) is hereby amended by adding Section 33.107 as follows:

§33.107 HEALTH INSURANCE BENEFITS

Upon qualification for PSEBA benefits, the Applicant shall be entitled to the City's basic group health insurance plan. Basic group health insurance plan shall mean the lowest-cost plan available to the City. The basic group health insurance plan may change from time to time. An Applicant may choose to enroll in any other health insurance plan offered by the City different from the basic group health insurance plan, but shall pay the difference in insurance premium between the City's basic plan and the other plan. Failure of the PSEBA beneficiary to timely pay the premium's non-basic level coverage shall result in coverage in the basic plan. PSEBA benefits do not include benefits not provided under the City's basic group health insurance plan such as, but not limited to, disability benefits, life insurance, dental or vision benefits, etc.

- A. *Open Enrollment.* Individuals receiving benefits under PSEBA will only be able to change from one plan to another during the City's Open Enrollment Period.
- B. *Other Benefits.* Health insurance benefits payable from any other source will reduce the benefits payable from the City. Each Applicant shall sign an affidavit attesting that the Applicant is not eligible for insurance benefits from any other source, unless there is another source. If there is another source, the Applicant shall notify the City of that source no later than five (5) business days from that source becoming available to the Applicant or the Applicant's beneficiaries. The City reserves the right on an annual basis

to have the benefit recipient provide another affidavit affirming whether other health insurance is available or payable to the Applicant, his/her spouse and/or his/her qualifying dependent children. The affidavit must be completed and returned to the City within thirty (30) calendar days of written notice from the City. If the recipient does not complete and return the affidavit within the time required, the City shall give the recipient an additional written notice providing an additional fifteen (15) calendar days for the recipient to complete and return the affidavit. Failure to return the affidavit within the time required shall result in the recipient incurring responsibility for reimbursing the City for premiums paid during the period the affidavit is due and not filed.

- C. *Disclosure of Health Insurance Coverage.* The Applicant has an ongoing obligation and shall update health insurance coverage information provided and failure to do so may result in the denial of benefits and/or reimbursement to the City for duplicate coverage. If duplicate coverage has been received by a PSEBA beneficiary, further PSEBA benefits will be denied until the City has been fully reimbursed by the PSEBA beneficiary for what it would have been credited if it had known about other coverage.
- D. *Reimbursement.* Receipt of health insurance benefits from other sources without notice to the City shall require the Applicant to reimburse the City for the value of those benefits.
- E. *Medicare Eligibility.* The Applicant shall notify the City when the Applicant becomes Medicare eligible regardless of the status of the enrollment period, so the City may assist with the transition to Medicare coverage and/or adjust health insurance benefits or PSEBA benefits accordingly.

Section 2. SEVERABILITY. If any provision of this Ordinance or application thereof to any person or circumstance is ruled unconstitutional or otherwise invalid, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this ordinance that can be given effect without the invalid application or provision, and each invalid provision or invalid application of this Ordinance is severable.

Section 3. CONFLICT OF LAWS. Where the conditions imposed by any provisions of this Ordinance are more restrictive than comparable provisions imposed elsewhere in any other local law, ordinance, resolution, rule or regulation, the regulations of this Ordinance will govern.

Section 4. PUBLICATION OF ORDINANCE. The City Clerk shall publish this ordinance in pamphlet form.

Section 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, as provided by law.

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE IS NOW OPERATING UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE ILLINOIS MUNICIPAL CODE, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED AND AS A HOME RULE MUNICIPALITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII OF THE ILLINOIS CONSTITUTION OF 1970; AND IN THE EXERCISE OF ITS HOME RULE POWERS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ILLINOIS:

Section 1. That **Section 121.06** is hereby amended by repealing **Section 121.06** in its entirety, and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

§ 121.06 LICENSE CLASSIFICATIONS, FEES, NUMBERS.

(A) *Generally.* Such license shall be divided into the following classes:

(1) Class "A", which shall permit the retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on or off the premises where sold and not for resale in any form. The annual fee for such license shall be \$650; provided, however, that such fee shall increase to \$700, effective April 1, 2019. The total number of Class "A" licenses shall not exceed 53. No Class "A" license shall be issued except to a licensee who actually sells at retail alcoholic liquor for consumption both on and off the premises where sold;

(2) (a) Class "B", which shall permit the retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises of restaurants, but not for consumption off the premises of restaurants and not for resale in any form. For the purpose of this Class "B" license, a **RESTAURANT** is defined to mean a public place kept, used, maintained, advertised and held out to the public, where meals are served and where meals actually are served and regularly served, without sleeping accommodations; such space being provided with adequate and sanitary kitchen and dining room equipment and capacity and having employed therein a sufficient number and kind of employees to prepare, cook and serve suitable foods for its guests; it is further provided that a restaurant as herein defined shall mean an establishment which derives more than 50% of its gross sales from the sale of food. The annual fee for such license shall be \$650; provided, however, that such fee shall increase to \$700,

effective April 1, 2019. There shall be no limit on the number of Class “B” licenses; and

(b) At any time during the license period or prior to the renewal of a Class “B” license, the Mayor may order the licensee to produce his or her accounting records to determine if the licensee is qualified to hold a Class “B” liquor license. The failure of the licensee to produce said records for the Mayor upon request, shall result in the automatic revocation of a Class “B” liquor license.

(3) Class “C”, which shall only permit the retail sale of alcoholic liquor in sealed packages, but not for consumption on the premises of where it is sold; provided that single-serving containers of alcoholic beverages in a volume of 40 fluid ounces or less shall only be cooled/chilled in an electrical refrigeration unit and shall not be displayed for sale at the cashier/check-out counter. The annual fee for such license shall be \$800. The total number of Class “C” licenses shall not exceed 50. The holder of a Class “C” liquor license shall not conduct video gaming under the Illinois Video Gaming Act (230 ILCS 40/1 et seq.) provided, however, that, notwithstanding the foregoing, a bus/truck stop as defined in § 118.16 may conduct video gaming under the Illinois Video Gaming Act (230 ILCS 40/1 et seq.);

(4) Class “D”, which shall permit the retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption only on the premises where sold to be issued to a regularly organized club, such sales to be made only to the members and guests of the club, whether year-round or intermittent/seasonal. For the purposes of this chapter, a **CLUB** is defined to mean a corporation organized under the laws of this state, not for pecuniary profit, solely for the promotion of some common object other than the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquors. The annual fee for such license shall be \$400. There shall be no limit on the number of Class “D” licenses. No Class “D” license shall be issued until the Local Liquor Control Commissioner has satisfied himself or herself that the club applying for the license was actually and in fact, organized for some purpose or object other than the sale or consumption of alcoholic liquor;

(5) Class “E”, which shall permit the sale or dealing at retail in alcoholic liquor by a religious organization or a not-for-profit organization that does business only intermittently. The annual fee for such license shall be \$100. There shall be no limit on the number of Class “E” licenses; and

(6) Class “F”, which shall permit the retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption only on premises opened only periodically for the express purpose of providing accommodations for weddings, parties, bingo and other such special events. The annual fee for such license shall be \$400. There shall be no limit on the number of Class “F” licenses.

(B) *License classifications, fees and numbers.*

(1) All licenses expire on May 1 of each year. License fees are payable in full, in advance, to the Local Liquor Control Commissioner.

(2) It shall be unlawful to keep open for business or to admit the public to or permit the public to remain within or to permit the consumption of alcoholic liquor in or upon any premises in which alcoholic liquor is sold at retail during the hours in which the sale of such liquor is prohibited; provided, that where separate defined areas are used for dispensing of food stuffs and alcoholic beverages during the hours designated herein, such specified areas may continue to dispense food stuffs after its authorized closing hour as set forth herein, but shall in no way dispense alcoholic beverages after its authorized closing hour as set forth herein or allow consumption of alcoholic beverages after its authorized closing hour as set forth herein.

Section 2. That conflicting Ordinances or pertinent portions thereof in force the time this takes effect are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Should any portion of this Ordinance be declared void or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such ruling shall not affect the validity of the surviving portions of this section.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, as provided by law.

(~~B~~) Except as otherwise may be permitted by ordinance, no one may place a dumpster ~~or storage pod~~ on any private or public property in the city without registering the location with the city's Building Department. All such dumpsters ~~or storage pods~~ shall be removed within ~~60-30~~ days of the date of placement.

Section 2. That **Section 150.38(K)** is hereby amended by repealing **Section 150.38(K)** in its entirety, and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

(K) *Building Permit Table No. 11.*

PLACING DUMPSTER <u>OR STORAGE POD</u> WITHOUT A PERMIT: DOUBLE THE FEE
