Under the Agreement, the Licensee is permitted to use and occupy, on a temporary basis, the space described above (the "Room") in the Building at the Location set forth above (the "Building").

5. Licensee's Conduct. Licensee agrees to keep the Room in good condition and promptly repair all damage to the Premises or the Building caused by Licensee's negligence, and not to disrupt, adversely affect or interfere with other occupants of the Building.

9. Licensor's Right to Revoke License. Upon reasonable prior written notice to Licensee, Licensor may revoke the license represented by this Agreement if Licensee (a) fails to pay any fee or payment required hereunder or (b) breaches any other obligation hereunder and such breach continues after written notice from Licensor describing same. If this license is so revoked, Licensee shall forthwith vacate the Room in a neat and orderly manner. Licensor shall have all rights and remedies available to it under applicable law.

PROPERTY USE AGREEMENT

This Property Use Agreement is entered into by and between the City of Belleville, Illinois ("City") and Belleville Urban Garden Social Club, an Illinois non-profit corporation ("BUGS").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City is an Illinois municipal corporation that owns unimproved real estate located at 804-808 South High Street, Belleville, Illinois, St. Clair County Permanent Parcel No. 08-27.0-110-018 ("Property");

WHEREAS, BUGS is an Illinois not-profit corporation that desires to use the Property for a community garden;

WHEREAS, the City and BUGS desire to memorialize an agreement for BUGS use of the Property fields on the City's Property for a community garden.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Use.** The City shall permit BUGS to use the Property solely for purpose of a community garden, in full compliance with applicable laws and City ordinances, and for no other purpose.

2. **Consideration.** Upon execution of this Agreement, BUGS shall pay the City the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per year for BUGS' use of the Property for the term contemplated under this Agreement.

3. **Responsibilities.** Concerning its use of the Property, BUGS shall provide, at its sole cost and expense, any and all necessary materials/equipment/services, for the maintenance of the Property.

4. **Term.** The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year from March 1, 2019 to February 28, 2024, unless terminated sooner as provided herein. Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. Such "cause" is a breach of this Agreement that is not cured within seven (7) days written notice thereof from the other party.

5. **Indemnification and Hold Harmless.** Each party shall indemnify and hold harmless the other party from any claim or cause of action resulting from the act or omission of the indemnifying party, its agents and/or employees, concerning the use of the Premises under this Agreement. Both parties specifically represent that this agreement for indemnity does not waive any statutory immunity to which the City may be entitled by law, nor does it create any rights of action in any third party. BUGS shall further pay for any damages to the Property arising out of its use under this Agreement, whether such damage was accidental or deliberate.

6. **Insurance.** BUGS shall maintain commercial general liability insurance coverage with limits of at least Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) aggregate, against personal injury/death and/or property damage/loss, subject to the same limits for each person, in an amount not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000), naming the City as an additional insured, and proof/verification of same shall be submitted in writing to the City within thirty (30) days of the execution of this Agreement. Such insurance coverage shall be primary, non-contributory and include a waiver of subrogation in favor of the City.

7. **Strict Compliance.** No failure by either party to insist upon the strict performance of any covenant, term or condition of this Agreement, or to exercise any right or remedy upon a breach thereof, shall constitute a waiver of any such breach or any subsequent breach of such covenant, term or condition. No waiver of any breach shall affect or alter this Agreement, but each and every covenant, term and condition of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

8. **Notice.** All notices, requests, approvals, demands and other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given and to be effective when delivered personally (including delivery by express or courier service) or, if mailed, three (3) business days after being deposited in the United States mail as registered or certified matter, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, addressed as follows or to such other address as either party may designate by notice to the other party in accordance with this Paragraph 8:

11. **Assignment.** This Agreement may not be assigned by either party.

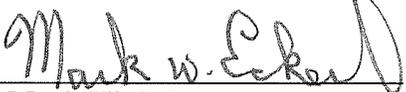

SECTION 1 DEFINITIONS AND PARTIES

This is an AGREEMENT between GONZALEZ COMPANIES, LLC, hereinafter referred to as the ENGINEER, and the CITY OF BELLEVILLE hereinafter referred to as the CLIENT.

The CLIENT proposes to engage the ENGINEER to furnish certain professional services in connection with BICENTENNIAL PARK OUTFALL DESIGN, which work is hereinafter referred to as the PROJECT.

SECTION 2 SCOPE OF SERVICES

BACKGROUND

The existing Park Outfall Structure consists of an earth fill berm with a drop shaft outfall structure. Overtopping of the berm has caused a section of the berm to wash out. ENGINEER performed a concept study in May 2019 to examine this issue and recommended, besides rebuilding the berm, that a new be built upstream of the berm consisting of an approximately 25-ft long concrete weir discharging to a riprap-lined channel. The purpose of this AGREEMENT is to develop the concept into a set of bid documents for construction.

TASK 1 GEOTECHNICAL AND SURVEYS

ENGINEER will perform additional field surveys to pick up ground elevations and topographic features not obtained during the concept phase, as needed for preparation of construction plans.

ENGINEER will define a geotechnical field investigation required for design of the PROJECT. CLIENT will furnish the services of a geotechnical firm to perform this work – including drilling, cone penetrometer testing (CPT), sampling, field supervision, lab testing, boring logs and lab reports. ENGINEER will provide surveying to stake or tie-in the boring and CPT locations.

ENGINEER will interpret the findings of the geotechnical investigation, perform slope stability calculations for the PROJECT's berm reconstruction, and assess the suitability of on-site excavation material for use in the berm reconstruction.

TASK 2 PRELIMINARY DESIGN

ENGINEER will finalize hydraulic calculations for design of the proposed weir structure, spillway channel, and slope protection. ENGINEER will prepare preliminary drawings and specifications, showing the work including proposed berm reconstruction, site grading, weir and spillway construction, storm water pollution prevention, slope protection and channel lining materials. The preliminary design will be generally in accordance with the recommended concept. ENGINEER will submit the preliminary drawings and specifications to CLIENT for review.

CLIENT will provide available soils data, surveys, drawings, and other pertinent data from past construction of facilities in close proximity to the PROJECT such as the berm, outfall structure, and slope protection, including available geotechnical data from the entrance road bridge. CLIENT will furnish copies of any permitting correspondence related to the berm and outfall.

TASK 3 FINAL DOCUMENTS AND BID ASSISTANCE

ENGINEER will meet with CLIENT to receive review comments on the preliminary submittal. ENGINEER will address the review comments and revise the preliminary documents accordingly. ENGINEER will provide CLIENT with one electronic copy of project manual including technical specifications, drawings, and Engineer's Opinion of Probable Cost.

CLIENT will reproduce documents for bidding and conduct the bidding and award process. As requested by CLIENT, ENGINEER will provide bid assistance including evaluation of bids, participation in pre-bid meeting, and preparation of bid addenda (if any).

CLIENT will provide any standard front-end documents that are to be incorporated into the final bid documents in an acceptable electronic format. CLIENT will identify its insurance requirements to be stipulated in the bid document.

TASK 4 IDNR COORDINATION

ENGINEER will submit preliminary design and general informational material on the project to the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) Dam Safety Office in the interest of determining whether the existing structures and/or proposed construction requires a permit from the IDNR.

ASSUMPTIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS

It is assumed that neither the existing berm and drop shaft structures nor the proposed new construction require an IDNR permit. This assumption cannot be confirmed until the preliminary design phase has been completed. If IDNR determines that the project requires a permit, CLIENT may authorize ENGINEER to proceed with preparation of permit application materials

and related coordination and follow-up work on a time and materials basis using ENGINEER's standard billing rates.

SECTION 3 TIME FOR PERFORMANCE

DELIVERABLE SCHEDULE

1. Scope of geotechnical field investigations will be submitted 10 working days from Notice to Proceed (NTP).
2. Preliminary Design Documents will be submitted within 20 working days of receipt of geotechnical firm's boring logs, CPT reports, and laboratory test reports.
3. Final Documents will be submitted within 20 working days of receipt of CLIENT's review comments. If IDNR determines that a permit is required for the proposed work, this schedule will be revised to provide for the additional requirements of the permitting process.

SECTION 4 COMPENSATION

The ENGINEER agrees to perform tasks 1 through 4 within SECTION 2 SCOPE OF SERVICES for a LUMP SUM fee of forty-seven thousand seven hundred thirty-four dollars (47,734.00 USD) unless scope changes occur. The ENGINEER may submit invoices as frequently as monthly.

Any opinions of probably project cost or probable construction cost provided by ENGINEER are made on the basis of information available to ENGINEER and on the basis of ENGINEER's experience and qualifications, and represents its judgment as an experienced and qualified professional. However, since ENGINEER has no control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment or services furnished by others, or over the contract(s)' methods of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, ENGINEER does not guarantee that proposals, bids or actual project or construction cost will not vary from opinions of probable cost ENGINEER prepares.

4. CONSTRUCTION PROCEDURES

ENGINEER's observation or monitoring portions of the work performed under construction contracts shall not relieve the contractor from its responsibility for performing work in accordance with applicable contract documents. ENGINEER shall not control or have charge of, and shall not be responsible for, construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures of construction, health or safety programs or precautions connected with the work and shall not manage, supervise, control or have charge of construction. ENGINEER shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of the contractor or other parties on the project. ENGINEER shall be entitled to review all construction contract documents and to require that no provisions extend the duties or liabilities of ENGINEER beyond those set forth in this Agreement. CLIENT/OWNER agrees to include ENGINEER as an indemnified party in CLIENT/OWNER's construction contracts for the work, which shall protect ENGINEER to the same degree as CLIENT/OWNER. Further, CLIENT/OWNER agrees that ENGINEER shall be listed as an additional insured under the construction contractor's liability insurance policies.

5. CONTROLLING LAW

This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the state of Missouri or if agreed in writing with CLIENT/OWNER where ENGINEER'S services are performed.

6. SERVICES AND INFORMATION

CLIENT/OWNER will provide all criteria and information pertaining to CLIENT/OWNER's requirements for the project, including design objectives and constraints, space, capacity and performance requirements, flexibility and expandability, and any budgetary limitations. CLIENT/OWNER will also provide copies of any CLIENT/OWNER-furnished Standard Details, Standard Specifications, or Standard Bidding Documents which are to be incorporated into the project. CLIENT/OWNER will furnish the services of soils/geotechnical engineers or other consultants that include reports and appropriate professional recommendations when such services are deemed necessary by ENGINEER. The CLIENT/OWNER agrees to bear full responsibility for the technical

accuracy and content of CLIENT/OWNER-furnished documents and services.

In performing professional engineering, construction management, and related services hereunder, it is understood by CLIENT/OWNER that ENGINEER is not engaged in rendering any type of legal, insurance or accounting services, opinions or advice. Further, it is the CLIENT/OWNER's sole responsibility to obtain the advice of an attorney, insurance counselor or accountant to protect the CLIENT/OWNER's legal and financial interests. To that end, the CLIENT/OWNER agrees that CLIENT/OWNER or the CLIENT/OWNER's representative will examine all studies, reports, sketches, drawings, specifications, proposals and other documents, opinions or advice prepared or provided by ENGINEER, and will obtain the advice of an attorney, insurance counselor or other consultant as the CLIENT/OWNER deems necessary to protect the CLIENT/OWNER's interests before CLIENT/OWNER takes action or forebears to take action based upon or relying upon the services provided by ENGINEER.

7. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

CLIENT/OWNER and ENGINEER, respectively, bind themselves, their partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the covenants of this Agreement. Neither CLIENT/OWNER nor ENGINEER will assign, sublet, or transfer and interest in this Agreement or claims arising therefrom without the written consent of the other.

8. RE-USE OF DOCUMENTS

All documents, including all reports, drawings, specifications, computer software or other items prepared or furnished by ENGINEER pursuant to this Agreement, are instruments of service with respect to the project. ENGINEER retains ownership of all such documents. CLIENT/OWNER may retain copies of the documents for its information and reference in connection with the project; however, none of the documents are intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by CLIENT/OWNER or others on extensions of the project or on any other project. Any reuse without written verification or adaptation by ENGINEER for the specific purpose intended will be at CLIENT/OWNER's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to ENGINEER, and CLIENT/OWNER will define, indemnify and hold harmless ENGINEER from all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including attorney's fees, arising or resulting therefrom. Any such verification or adaptation will entitle ENGINEER to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by CLIENT/OWNER and ENGINEER.

9. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

CLIENT/OWNER or ENGINEER may terminate the Agreement, in whole or in part, by giving no less than ten (10) business days written notice, if the other party substantially fails to fulfill its obligations under the Agreement through no fault of the terminating party. Where the method of payment is "lump sum," time & material, or cost reimbursement, the final invoice will include all services and expenses associated with the project up to the effective date of termination plus a fifteen percent fee mark-up for the final invoice amount. An equitable adjustment shall also be made to provide for termination settlement costs ENGINEER incurs as a result of commitments that had become agreed upon before termination, and for a reasonable profit for services performed.

10. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding upon the parties. One or more waivers by either party of any provision, term or condition shall not be construed by the other party as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same provision, term or condition.

11. INVOICES

ENGINEER will submit invoices for services rendered and CLIENT/OWNER will make prompt payments in response to ENGINEER's invoices. ENGINEER will retain receipts for reimbursable expenses in general accordance with rules pertaining to the support of expenditures for income tax purposes. Receipts will be available for inspection by CLIENT/OWNER's auditors upon request.

If CLIENT/OWNER disputes any items in ENGINEER's invoice for any reason, including the lack of supporting documentation, CLIENT/OWNER may temporarily delete the disputed item and pay the remaining amount of the invoice, so as not to hold payment. CLIENT/OWNER will promptly notify ENGINEER of the dispute and request clarification and/or correction. After any dispute has been settled, ENGINEER will include the disputed item on a subsequent, regularly scheduled invoice, or on a special invoice for the disputed item only.

CLIENT/OWNER recognizes that late payment of invoices results in extra expenses for ENGINEER; ENGINEER retains the right to assess CLIENT/OWNER interest at the rate of one percent (1%) per month, but not to exceed the maximum rate allowed by law, on invoices which are not paid within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of the invoice. In the event undisputed portions of ENGINEER's invoices are not paid when due, ENGINEER also reserves the right, after seven (7) business days prior written notice, to suspend the performance of its services until all past due amounts have been paid in full.

12. **CHANGES**

The parties agree that no change or modification to the Agreement, or Task Order, or any attachments hereto, shall have any force or effect unless the change is reduced to writing, dated, and made part of the Task Order. The execution of the change shall be authorized and signed in the same manner as this Agreement. Adjustments in the period of services and in compensation shall be in accordance with applicable paragraphs and sections of the Task Order. Any proposed fees by ENGINEER are estimates to perform the services required to complete the project as ENGINEER understands it to be defined. For those projects involving conceptual or process development services, activities often are not fully definable in the time of performance and compensation scope and adjustments to the time of performance and compensation can be made as required. If such change, additional services, or suspension of services results in an increase or decrease in the cost of or time required for performance of the services, and equitable adjustment shall be made, and the Task Order modified accordingly.

13. **CONTROLLING AGREEMENT**

These Terms and Conditions shall take precedence over any inconsistent or contradictory provisions contained in any proposal, contract, purchase order, requisition, notice-to-proceed, or like document or Task Order.

14. **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT AND NONDISCRIMINATION**

In connection with the services under the Agreement, ENGINEER agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of federal and state Equal Employment Opportunity, and other employment, statutes and regulations.

15. **HAZARDOUS MATERIALS**

CLIENT/OWNER represents to ENGINEER that, to the best of its knowledge, no hazardous materials are present at the project site. However, in the event hazardous materials are known to be present, CLIENT/OWNER represents that to the best of its knowledge it has disclosed to ENGINEER the existence of all such hazardous materials, including but not limited to asbestos, PCB's, petroleum, hazardous waste, or radioactive material located at or near the project site, including type, quantity and location of such hazardous materials. It is acknowledged by both parties that ENGINEER's scope of services do not include services related in any way to encounters undisclosed hazardous materials, ENGINEER shall have the obligation to notify CLIENT/OWNER and, to the extent required by law or regulation, the appropriate governmental officials, and ENGINEER may, at its option and without liability for delay, consequential or any other damages to CLIENT/OWNER, suspend performance of services on that portion of the project affected by hazardous materials until CLIENT/OWNER: (i) retains appropriate specialist consultant(s) or contractor(s) to identify and, as appropriate, abate, remediate, or remove the hazardous materials; and (ii) warrants that the project site is in full compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

CLIENT/OWNER acknowledges that ENGINEER is performing professional services for CLIENT/OWNER and that ENGINEER is not and shall not be required to become an "arranger," "operator," "generator," or "transporter" of hazardous materials, as defined in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1990 (CERCLA), which are or may be encountered at or near the project site in connection with ENGINEER's services under this

Task Order. If ENGINEER's services hereunder cannot be performed because of the existence of hazardous materials, ENGINEER shall be entitled to terminate this Task Order for cause on 30 calendar days written notice. To the fullest extent permitted by law, CLIENT/OWNER shall indemnify and hold harmless ENGINEER, its officers, directors, partners, employees, and subconsultants from and against all costs, losses, and damages (including but not limited to all fees and charges of engineers, architects, attorneys, and other professionals, and all court or arbitration or other dispute resolution costs) caused by, arising out of or resulting from hazardous materials, provided that (i) any such cost, loss, or damage is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than completed Work), including the loss of use resulting there from, and (ii) nothing in this paragraph shall obligate CLIENT/OWNER to indemnify any individual or entity from and against the consequences of that individual's or entity's sole negligence or willful misconduct.

16. **EXECUTION**

This Agreement and subsequent changes, including the exhibits and schedules made part hereof, constitute the entire agreement between ENGINEER and CLIENT/OWNER, supersedes and controls over all prior written or oral understandings. This agreement may be amended, supplemented or modified only by a written instrument duly executed by the parties.

17. **LIMITATION OF LIABILITY**

ENGINEER's and its employees' total liability to CLIENT/OWNER for any loss or damage, including but not limited to special and consequential damages arising out of or in connection with the performance of services or any other cause, including ENGINEER's and its employees' professional negligent acts, errors, or omissions, shall not exceed the lesser of \$5,000 or the total compensation received by ENGINEER hereunder, and CLIENT/OWNER hereby releases and holds harmless ENGINEER and its employees from any liability above such amount.

18. **LITIGATION SUPPORT**

In the event ENGINEER is required to respond to a subpoena, government inquiry or other legal process related to the services in connection with a legal or dispute resolution proceeding to which ENGINEER is not a party, CLIENT/OWNER shall reimburse ENGINEER for reasonable costs in responding and compensate ENGINEER at its then standard rates for reasonable time incurred in gathering information and documents and attending depositions, hearings, and trial.

19. **UTILITY LOCATION**

If underground sampling/testing is to be performed, a utility locating service shall be contracted to make arrangements for all utilities to determine the location of underground utilities. In addition, CLIENT/OWNER shall notify ENGINEER of the presence and location of any underground utilities located on the CLIENT/OWNER's property which are not the responsibility of other private/public utilities. ENGINEER shall take reasonable precautions to avoid damaging underground utilities that are properly marked. The CLIENT/OWNER agrees to waive any claim against ENGINEER and will indemnify and hold ENGINEER harmless from any claim of liability, injury or loss caused by or allegedly caused by ENGINEER's damaging of underground utilities that are not properly marked or are not called to ENGINEER's attention prior to beginning the underground sampling/testing.

20. **ESCALATION**

Annual rate escalation of 6% effective January 1, 2015.

21. **PREPAYMENT**

Upon acceptance of this Agreement by the CLIENT/OWNER, a payment of 6% of the total fee may be required to initialize the project and may be exercised by ENGINEER at any time.

22. **JOB CANCELLATION FOR CONVENIENCE FEE**

Because of potentially significant revenues from other projects forgone by the ENGINEER to take this project, if the project is cancelled by the CLIENT/OWNER, a cancellation fee of 10% of contract will be immediately due and payable for project's current billings, work-in-progress, and reimbursable expenses.

23. **PROJECT RESTART FEE**
Because of substantial cost incurred by the ENGINEER to stop and restart a project once it is underway, should this project's progress be halted at any time for thirty (30) or more calendar days by the CLIENT/OWNER, for any reason, a project restart fee of 10% of the total contract fee to date will be due and payable immediately.
24. **LATE PENALTY SCHEDULE**
All invoices not paid promptly will be subject to the following late payment penalty: 30 to 59 calendar days overdue, \$650; 60 to 89 calendar days overdue, \$850; 90 to 120 calendar days overdue, \$1250; in addition to the interest charges as outlined in term and condition 11.
25. **LIMITATION OF DESIGN ALTERNATIVES**
The ENGINEER will limit the number of design alternatives provided under this contract to three, upon which time the design will be considered complete.
26. **GRAPHICS CONTROL**
Because of its standing as a professional design firm, the ENGINEER has complete control over graphic content and presentation of all studies, reports, and all other documents produced under this agreement.
27. **HIGHER FEES PAID FOR CHANGES**
Any changes requested by the CLIENT/OWNER to the scope of services provided under this agreement after acceptance of 25% completion will be billed at 1.15 times billing rates.

STANDARD CERTIFICATIONS FOR INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENTS

Public Agency acknowledges and agrees that compliance with this section and each subsection for the term of the contract and any renewals is a material requirement and condition of this contract. By executing this contract Public Agency certifies compliance with this section and each subsection and is under a continuing obligation to remain in compliance and report any non-compliance.

If this contract extends over multiple fiscal years including the initial term and all renewals, Public Agency shall confirm compliance with this section in the manner and format determined by the State by the date specified by the State and in no event later than July 1 of each year that this contract remains in effect.

If the Parties determine that any certification in this section is not applicable to this contract it may be stricken without affecting the remaining subsections.

1. As part of each certification, Public Agency acknowledges and agrees that should Public Agency provide false information, or fail to be or remain in compliance with the Standard Certification requirements, one or more of the following sanctions will apply:

- the contract may be void by operation of law,
- the State may void the contract, and
- the Public Agency or its agents may be subject to one or more of the following: suspension, debarment, denial of payment, civil fine, or criminal penalty.

Identifying a sanction or failing to identify a sanction in relation to any of the specific certifications does not waive imposition of other sanctions or preclude application of sanctions not specifically identified.

2. Public Agency certifies it and its employees will comply with applicable provisions of the U.S. Civil Rights Act, Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act, the Americans with Disabilities Act (42 U.S.C. § 12101 et seq.) and applicable rules in performance under this contract.

3. If Public Agency employs 25 or more employees and this contract is worth more than \$5000, Public Agency certifies it will provide a drug free workplace pursuant to the Drug Free Workplace Act. (30 ILCS 580)

4. Public Agency certifies that the Public Agency is not participating or shall not participate in an international boycott in violation of the U.S. Export Administration Act of 1979 or the applicable regulations of the U.S. Department of Commerce. This applies to contracts that exceed \$10,000 (30 ILCS 582).

5. Public Agency certifies it complies with the Illinois Department of Human Rights Act and rules applicable to public contracts, including equal employment opportunity, refraining from unlawful discrimination, and having written sexual harassment policies (775 ILCS 5/2-105).

6. Public Agency certifies it does not pay dues to or reimburse or subsidize payments by its employees for any dues or fees to any "discriminatory club" (775 ILCS 25/2).

7. Public Agency warrants and certifies that it and, to the best of its knowledge, its subcontractors have and will comply with Executive Order No. 1 (2007). The Order generally prohibits Contractors and subcontractors from hiring the then-serving Governor's family members to lobby procurement activities of the State, or any other unit of government in Illinois including local governments if that procurement may result in a contract valued at over \$25,000. This prohibition also applies to hiring for that same purpose any former State employee who had procurement authority at any time during the one-year period preceding the procurement lobbying activity.

8. THIS AGREEMENT is made between the City of Belleville, 407 East Lincoln, Belleville, Illinois, 62220, hereinafter referred to as the "CITY," and the State of Illinois/Department of Natural Resources, Office of Mines and Minerals, Abandoned Mined Lands Reclamation Division, hereinafter referred to as the "DEPARTMENT,"

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the DEPARTMENT has determined that a section of public roadway located in the 9800 block of West Main Street, Belleville, Illinois, has been severely damaged by subsidence caused by mining activity that occurred prior to August 3rd, 1977; that the damages to the roadway and the resultant ponding of water constitutes a threat to human health and welfare; and that the problem area is thus eligible for funds from the Abandoned Mined Lands Reclamation Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, the CITY and the DEPARTMENT are both legal entities organized and existing under the laws of the State of Illinois having among their powers the authority to perform such undertakings as described herein under the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act," 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the DEPARTMENT has approved participation in abandoned mined land reclamation projects to the extent allowed by its statutory authority under the "Abandoned Mined Lands and Water Act," 20 ILCS 1920/1.01 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, the CITY and the DEPARTMENT wish to complete the Main Street Sag 2019 Reclamation Project, hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT," which includes the design, implementation and performance of work to address the damaged roadway (See Attachment B – West Main Street Storm Sewer Improvements, prepared by Kuhlmann design Group, Inc., 66 Progress Parkway, St. Louis, Missouri 63043-3706, dated January 2019); and

WHEREAS, the Illinois General Assembly appropriated to the DEPARTMENT sufficient funds from the Abandoned Mined Lands Reclamation Federal Trust Fund for activities relating to the design, implementation and construction of abandoned mined land reclamation projects throughout the State and to complete the PROJECT; and

WHEREAS, the DEPARTMENT has determined that the execution of this AGREEMENT is subject to the signature requirements of the "State Finance Act," 30 ILCS 105/9.02.

WHEREAS, under penalty of perjury, the CITY certifies that _____ is its correct Federal Taxpayer Identification Number and that the CITY is doing business as a government entity;

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the benefits to be derived from the completion of the PROJECT, the sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, it is agreed between the parties hereto as follows:

PART A. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. The recitals set forth above are incorporated by reference and made a part hereof, the same constituting the factual basis for this transaction.

2. The DEPARTMENT's funding obligation under this AGREEMENT will terminate upon the completion of the PROJECT, when the DEPARTMENT's maximum cost share is expended, or March 31, 2020, whichever comes first. This AGREEMENT is contingent upon and subject to the availability of funds. The State, at its sole option, may terminate or suspend this AGREEMENT, in whole or in part, without penalty of further payment being required, if (1) the Illinois General Assembly or the federal funding source fails to make an appropriation sufficient to pay such obligation, or if funds needed are insufficient for any reason, (2) the Governor decreases the DEPARTMENT's funding by reserving some or all of the DEPARTMENT's appropriation(s) pursuant to power delegated to the Governor by the Illinois General Assembly; or (3) the DEPARTMENT determines, in its sole discretion or as directed by the Office of the Governor, that a reduction is necessary or advisable based upon actual or projected budgetary considerations. Contractor will be notified in writing of the failure of appropriation or of a reduction or decrease.

3. The DEPARTMENT will not participate in any PROJECT costs incurred by the CITY prior to the full execution of this AGREEMENT unless otherwise agreed to by the parties.

4. All provisions of this AGREEMENT will be binding upon the successors and assigns of the principal parties hereto.

5. This AGREEMENT may only be modified, assigned, supplemented, amended or extended by mutual agreement, in writing, by the parties hereto.

PART B. CITY OF BELLEVILLE

1. The CITY shall prepare, or cause to be prepared, the final design plans, specifications, and contract documents; advertise for bids; make the contract award; and shall supervise the construction (resident engineering) for the PROJECT. The forgoing CITY activities are subject to the DEPARTMENT's review and approval set forth in part C.1. herein.

2. The CITY shall be responsible for determining designated boundaries of the lands, permanent easements, and permanent rights-of-way, hereinafter referred to as "property rights," required for the construction, operation and perpetual maintenance of the PROJECT. Upon its own judgment, investigation and due diligence pertaining to matters of title, the CITY shall acquire all necessary and additional property rights, including, but not limited to, right-of-entry upon privately owned lands that may be impacted by the construction, operation and maintenance of the PROJECT.

3. The CITY shall provide the DEPARTMENT with three days notice prior to the start of construction. Upon completion of the PROJECT, the CITY shall, within three days, provide notice to the DEPARTMENT of said completion.

4. The CITY has established Tim Gregowicz, City Engineer, as the official point of contact for all correspondence pertaining to the PROJECT.

5. The CITY hereby grants to the DEPARTMENT, or its assignee, the right to enter upon any property rights, held in the name of the CITY, for the purpose of construction inspection, maintenance inspection, and in the event the provisions of Part C. 4. herein are invoked by the DEPARTMENT for failure of the CITY to operate and maintain the PROJECT.

6. The CITY shall be responsible for obtaining all federal, state and local permits required for the construction and maintenance of the PROJECT. The CITY shall be responsible to abide by all federal, state and local laws and regulations during construction, operation, and maintenance of the PROJECT, and to satisfy all state and federal environmental laws, regulations, and executive orders that apply because of state funds being used on the PROJECT.

7. The CITY shall be responsible for all construction costs in excess of \$20,732.80. The DEPARTMENT will be responsible for up to its maximum cost share pursuant to Part C. 3. The DEPARTMENT will only be responsible for construction costs related to the PROJECT. The CITY will be responsible for the payment of all costs over and above the DEPARTMENT's maximum cost share. The CITY will document, to the satisfaction of the DEPARTMENT, that it has sufficient funds to complete the PROJECT before construction begins.

8. This AGREEMENT calls for the construction of a "public work," within the meaning of the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/01 et seq. (Act). The Act requires contractors and subcontractors to pay laborers, workers and mechanics performing services on public works projects no less than the "prevailing rate of wages" (hourly case wages plus fringe benefits) in the county where the work is performed. For information regarding current prevailing wage rates, please refer to the Illinois Department of Labor's website at: <http://www.state.il.us/agency/idol/rates/rates.HTM>. All contractors and subcontractors rendering services under this contract must comply with all requirements of the Act, including but not limited to, all wage, notice and record keeping duties. The CITY shall notify each of its contractors and subcontractors that this PROJECT is subject to and covered by the Act. The CITY shall require its contractors and subcontractors to submit certified payrolls as required by the Act and shall make these certified payrolls available to the DEPARTMENT for review. The CITY shall require each contractor and subcontractor performing work on this PROJECT to include the DEPARTMENT as a named insured on the contractor's and subcontractor's general liability insurance policy.

9. The CITY shall supply all documentation necessary to support any requests for payment of costs from the DEPARTMENT as indicated in Part C. 3.

10. The CITY, without cost to the DEPARTMENT, shall assume all responsibility for the operation, maintenance, repair and rehabilitation of the PROJECT after construction completion to ensure that it will serve the intended purpose. Maintenance will include, but not be limited to, all maintenance requirements set forth in any dam safety permits issues for the PROJECT.

11. The CITY shall maintain, for a minimum of three years after the completion of the PROJECT, adequate books, records, and supporting documents to verify the amounts, recipients, and uses of all disbursements of funds paid in conjunction with this AGREEMENT. This AGREEMENT and all books, records, and supporting documents related to the PROJECT will be made available for review and audit by the Illinois Auditor General and/or the DEPARTMENT. The CITY agrees to cooperate fully with any audit conducted by the Auditor General and/or the DEPARTMENT and to provide full access to all relevant materials. Failure to maintain the books, records and supporting documents required by this Part B. 9. will establish a presumption in favor of the DEPARTMENT for recovery of any funds paid by the DEPARTMENT under this AGREEMENT for which adequate books, records and supporting documentation are not available to support their purported disbursement.

12. The CITY shall hold and save the DEPARTMENT and any of its duly appointed agents and employees harmless against any loss, damage, cause of action, fine or judgment, including all cost connected therewith, such as attorney and witness fees, filing fees and any other expenses incident thereto, that may be incurred by reason of personal injury, death, property damage and any and all other claims or suits of whatsoever nature that might arise or result from or as a consequence of the PROJECT, specifically including but not limited to the design, location, construction, operation and maintenance of the PROJECT. The CITY shall further hold the DEPARTMENT harmless in regard to the handling and disposal of any hazardous or special wastes that might be discovered on any part of the PROJECT property rights. The CITY will not be responsible to hold the DEPARTMENT harmless against any loss, damages, cost or expenses arising out of negligent acts or omissions by the DEPARTMENT or its agents or employees.

13. The CITY shall complete the attached Certification Document, marked Attachment A, which will be incorporated as part of this agreement.

PART C. DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

1. The DEPARTMENT will review and approve in writing the final design plans and specifications of the PROJECT to assure acceptable project design, and will approve in writing the final PROJECT plan. The DEPARTMENT

will review and approve in writing all bid documents, bids, and contract documents. The DEPARTMENT may also make random inspections during the construction of the PROJECT.

2. The DEPARTMENT has established Bryan Johnsrud, Project Manager, as the official point of contact for all correspondence pertaining to the PROJECT.

3. The DEPARTMENT's maximum cost share in this PROJECT is \$20,732.80. The CITY will be responsible for all costs in excess of the DEPARTMENT's share. The DEPARTMENT will only be responsible for construction costs of the PROJECT. The DEPARTMENT will make payments to the CITY for PROJECT construction costs based on billings furnished by the CITY to the DEPARTMENT, with documentation in the form of an "Engineer's Pay Estimate," approved by the CITY's resident engineer, certifying that the work covered under such billings has been completed, is in connection with the construction of the PROJECT, and is in line with the original estimates for the PROJECT. The DEPARTMENT will review and give final approval of all submitted costs prior to submitting all such costs for payment in accordance with State law and procedures. Reimbursement will be made to the CITY on a monthly basis for verified work items completed.

4. The DEPARTMENT will make a final inspection upon completion of the project and may make periodic inspections subsequent to the completion of the PROJECT in order to ensure that adequate maintenance is being performed on the PROJECT. Should the DEPARTMENT determine that a maintenance problem exists, a joint inspection will be scheduled and made by the CITY and the DEPARTMENT. Failure of the CITY to properly maintain the PROJECT, as indicated by a written report of such inspection, will permit the DEPARTMENT, upon thirty (30) days written notice and continued failure of the CITY to perform the necessary maintenance work, to enter upon any of the PROJECT property rights for the purpose of performing such maintenance work. In this instance, the CITY will reimburse the DEPARTMENT for any and all costs that may be incurred by the DEPARTMENT in connection therewith.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have set their hands and seals the day and year written, and represents that the signatories below are duly authorized to execute this AGREEMENT on behalf of their respective bodies, and that the effective date of this AGREEMENT is the date approved and executed by the Director of the DEPARTMENT.
