Alderman Elmore: Sometimes I gain a better perspective after some thought about our discussions. After our last marathon meeting, I thought some more about what Chief Clay said. And most importantly the fact that this was Chief William Clay, a retired Air Force man that has served as our Chief of Police for fifteen some odd years. Chief Clay is always ready to positively support our community. This isn't some strong-arm tactic. This is public safety.

Then Garrett pointed out that this was a Policy Proposal. A guideline for future applications. I know I was in the mindset of treating his proposal like an Ordinance, a law. His proposal was not for a law. Every event has to apply by submitting paperwork with detailed plans for the event. Every year, every event. Then we have to pass it or not. Chief Clay's proposal does not suggest any change in the process. The City Council still has the final say. If an event organizer fills out an application with an end time of 11:00 p.m., they are welcome to. They could request midnight if they want.

We now know the dangers some events can potentially cause after 9:00 p.m. Chief Clay brought us factual previous activities. Other communities are making or have made adjustments to picnics and such. Chief pointed out that it is a fact, not opinion, that the danger presents itself after 9:00 p.m. He even pointed out 10:00 p.m. closing doesn't help. Problems arise at the fall of darkness. I for one would love to be the community taking the lead on safe events, rather than the community that has one of the few events at 10:30 p.m. at night and later. I have not attended these events the last four years, that's a flimsy excuse, but I've been a little out of the loop. I discovered the day after the marathon meeting, that somewhere a requirement has slipped through the cracks, and I think it's a big one. I can only speak for previous Belleville Homecomings because I chaired three of them, but we always put snow fencing around the fountain during DeutschFest. Now I find out we're not requiring that anymore? We have got to return to properly protecting our Memorial Fountain. It may not be attractive, but it is vital.

Two weeks ago, we were missing three Aldermen. Maybe you were viewing this as I was, an Ordinance. I sure wish I would've made a motion to table this agenda item two weeks ago. Two more weeks of contemplation would've served us well. But the reality is: the City Council still has to vote on every event, every year, every time. We now know, that 9:00 p.m. closing is the safest approach.

ADMINISTRATION

Alderwoman Eros made a motion second by Alderwoman Schaefer to approve Intergovernmental Agreement with Illinois State Police for laboratory/classroom and ancillary educational space at the City of Belleville educational campus located at 2300 West Main Street, Belleville.

City Attorney Hoerner: Just for public recital of the essential terms this is an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois State Police for the ISP Forensic Institute. A five-year term utilizing 4,416 square feet of the Main Building that includes laboratory space, office space, tourist space, etc. The first year is \$15.50 per square foot which is approximately \$16,000 for the first year and there is a 2% escalation each year thereafter. There is also a per diem basis, an opportunity for them to utilize other classroom space, meeting rooms, the auditorium, etc.

Alderman Ferguson made a motion second by Alderwoman Eros to approve Lease with Southern Illinois Law Enforcement Commission for office and ancillary educational space at the City of Belleville educational campus located at 2300 West Main Street, Belleville.

City Attorney Hoerner: The essential terms of this lease with the Southern Illinois Law Enforcement Commission are a ten-year term, 1,650 square feet utilized in the Dixon Center Building the rent is \$15.50 per square foot per year which is going to be entirely in advance, they also have the opportunity to utilize the additional classroom space and meeting rooms on a per diem basis.

Mayor Gregory: This is a ten-year term, but they are paying the entire amount up front.

City Attorney Hoerner: This is approximately \$25,000 per year.

Alderwoman Schaefer made a motion second Alderwoman Eros by to approve Facility Use Agreement with Southwestern Illinois Jets Basketball Club for nonexclusive use of gymnasium and ancillary athletic space at the City of Belleville educational campus located at 2300 West Main Street, Belleville

City Attorney Hoerner: The essential terms of this Facility Use Agreement is for the nonexclusive use of an arena, two gymnasiums, as well as, the office and locker rooms downstairs. The scenario of the nonexclusive use is that when it is not being utilized per schedule the Jets program can utilize that space or third parties that are authorized to utilize that space. It is a five-year term with a five-year renew option at the option of the Jet's organization. It is a 1% escalation clause each year and the average rent the first five-year term is \$75,000.

City Attorney Hoerner: This is an Intergovernmental Agreement with essential terms. Southwestern Illinois College would provide the necessary staffing for the maintenance and operation management of the campus, it is a ten-year term, and subject to approval by Illinois Community College Board that they would be relocating assistant programming such as the Police Academy which would utilize classrooms, fitness and outdoor space.

Mayor Gregory: We will be having a press conference after this and explaining some more. At this time, I would really love to just introduce the people that are here that are involved in this.

Lindenwood has been a story for many years, seventeen years they were here and then the last two years almost twenty years. It is a story of a government and community working together. I think it is a story that need to be told. When Mark Kern was Mayor, there were many of us sitting in this room that worked on the committee to bring Lindenwood University here and to make it a reality here in the City of Belleville. Of course, many of us stayed on the Foundation Board and the Community Board for several years and of course we were all heartbroken when we heard the news two years ago that they would be moving out of Belleville. The wonderful part is the citizens of this town were so devoted to having Lindenwood Campus being refurbished into something positive for the community that a group has been working together for two years with different agencies and organizations to make this happen. I think that just shows what community and government can do together and citizens that think they may not be that important in a community well they are dead wrong. Because citizens are the community.

At this time, I would like to thank you, as I call your name please stand up and be recognized, Bill Enyart and Annette Eckert, Otto Roberts, Bill Stiehl, Tom Farquhar, Roy Lantry, Tom Calhoun. Let us give a big round of applause. And we also want to thank for their support Senator Chris Belt, Representative Jay Hoffman, Representative LaToya Greenwood, and Chairman Mark Kern of St. Clair County. Without their support and their efforts this day would not be here. We want to thank all of them. Let us give them a big round of applause.

I also want to thank the Dixon Family, Alan J. Dixon Center which is a cornerstone of this campus and will continue to be a cornerstone. We will be using the Alan J. Dixon Center also for a community center, so it is going to have a wonderful purpose here in the community and we have to thank former Representative Thomas Holbrook for bringing us, working with a ton of people, the Illinois State Forensic Lab, state of the art, it is amazing. We took a tour through that several times throughout this whole process and it really is wonderful. I would also like to

recognize him because without that State Lab, a lot of this would not have happened. Let us give him a big round of applause.

At this time, we will be having a press conference out in the lobby and at that time I will read an opening statement from Brendan Kelly who could not be with us today, but he will be coming in the next couple of weeks. He is the Director of the Illinois State Police. Also, for Steve Lanter for his board members who are here tonight. Steve is just a wonderful person, and we were very lucky and fortunate to have him here in our community and he is still supporting our community. He will be the next speaker and then SILEC represented by Mr. David Hays and then SWIC represented by the President Nick Mance. If you would, I also have refreshments, because anybody who knows me, knows I love to feed people so out in the hallway while the press conference is going on we also have.



The December 2021 survey identified about 167 Inch Feet of cutting for a total cost of **\$9,045**. However, with municipal discount pricing applied, **total cost for this project will not exceed \$7,370***.

The sidewalk trip hazards are defined as differentials in the walkway of .375" high up to (including) 2.0" high. Trip hazards will be eliminated leaving a maximum running slope (ramp) of 1:8 as permitted to meet ADA requirements. Only 2 locations were out of scope for cutting that may need replacement work. **For this project, PCC will correct about 111 (129 nominal 5 Ft Wide) trip hazards** requiring about 167 Inch Feet (or 477+ lineal feet) of cutting.

The State of Illinois, acting by and through its Department of Transportation, is proposing a roadway improvement along IL159 from Washington Street to 0.2 miles South of IL 13/158 in Belleville. This work will consist of milling, resurfacing, and ADA Improvements.

Since parking lanes exist within the limits of the City of Belleville and are the responsibility of Belleville, this letter is to determine whether or not the City of Belleville would like to participate in this proposed roadway improvement by including the resurfacing of its parking lanes. The total estimated length of the parking lanes is approximately 3020 feet or 0.57 miles. This project is included in the Department's FY 2022-2027 Proposed Highway Improvement Program. This will serve as a Letter of Intent between the City of Belleville and the Department confirming your concurrence with the proposed improvement plan and the cost participation responsibilities for the project as described below.

The Illinois Department of Transportation has estimated the cost for milling and resurfacing of the parking lane which is present IL 159 from IL13/158 to Washington Street at an estimated cost of \$110,385. If the City would elect to participate in the resurfacing of these parking lanes, the cost of the resurfacing would be shared by the City (\$55,192.50) and the State (\$55,192.50) based on a 50/50 participation split. Any patching done within the parking lanes will be at 100% cost to the City. The actual cost will be based on final quantities as measured during construction.

GOVERNING SPECIFICATIONS:

The following Special Provisions Supplement the "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction", adopted January 1, 2019, the latest edition of the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways", and the "Manual of Test Procedures for Materials" in effect on the date of invitation for bids, and the Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions indicated on the Check Sheet included herein, which apply to and govern the work for the City of Belleville traffic signal and street light maintenance program, and in case of conflict with any part, or parts, of said Specifications, the said Special Provisions shall take precedence and shall govern.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK:

The CONTRACTOR shall be responsible for determining all methods, equipment, investigations, layout and supervision to achieve the end product. CONTRACTOR to perform all work on this project to the satisfaction of the CITY ENGINEER.

- A. This Contract/Proposal is being offered to establish a contract to provide the City of Belleville with traffic signal and street light maintenance and to have a qualified and capable contractor readily available for emergency work at established prices, subject to the terms and conditions contained in this Contract/Proposal.
- B. It is understood that there is no guarantee that work may or may not be performed by the contractor who is the successful bidder, but that the CONTRACTOR shall upon request, within the time element designated, do all work that is offered on a 24 hours, 7 day basis.
- C. The CONTRACTOR for specified unit prices listed in the contract shall furnish labor, tools and equipment, transportation for workmen, and any materials not provided by the City as required to service the City's electrical traffic signal control devices and City owned street lights. The work shall consist of repairing or replacing damaged electrical traffic control devices, street lights, and the City's Emergency Vehicle Priority System, servicing malfunctioning traffic signal controllers, traffic signal and street light relamping and cleaning, replacing loop detectors, modernizing existing electrical facilities, adding new facilities and providing whatever electrical services that are requested at locations specified by the City.
- D. The CONTRACTOR shall be available to respond to calls for service at all times to include Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays to correct any malfunctions of equipment or effect any temporary emergency repair to damaged equipment resulting from any cause.

- E. The CONTRACTOR shall designate at least four (4) responsible representatives of his organization to whom work orders may be issued and instructions may be given by the City. The CONTRACTOR shall furnish the names and telephone numbers of his representatives to the City. One of these representatives should be available at all times.

LOCATION:

Work covered by this contract shall include the electrical work on CITY MAINTAINED traffic signals and street lights within the City limits. A list of signals is at the end of these specifications.

BIDDING REQUIREMENTS:

Bids shall be submitted on the form furnished by the City and shall be sealed in a plain envelope marked on the outside with the words "TRAFFIC SIGNAL AND STREET LIGHT MAINTENANCE PROGRAM BID".

Bids are to reflect reasonable rates for the pay items listed in the Schedule of Prices. Bids that are unbalanced will be rejected.

LABOR RATES:

The CONTRACTOR shall submit labor rates for service performed on premium time. Premium time rates will be paid only as required by the I.B.E.W. contract in effect at the time a work order is issued.

CONTRACT PERIOD:

The initial terms of this contract shall be for the period beginning May 1, 2021 and continuing through April 30, 2022, at which time the contract shall terminate unless renewed per the below stated renewal provision.

OPTION TO RENEW:

This contract may be renewed for an additional one (1) year period for the same terms, prices and conditions, provided that the City and the contractor agree in writing to such a renewal at least thirty (30) days prior to termination of contract.

TERMINATION:

The CITY reserves the right to cancel and terminate this contract without penalty or further payment being required, for any cause determined to be in the best interest of the City, provided the City notifies the contractor of its intent to terminate in writing as thirty (30) days in advance of the effective termination date.

CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIVE:

The CONTRACTOR must assign a service representative to monitor City needs. He is to be prepared to handle any problems that may arise, and be prepared to make recommendations that will ensure the City of as smooth and efficient services as possible.

KNOWLEDGE / EXPERIENCE OF WORK FORCE:

The contractor must be pre-qualified with the Illinois Department of Transportation and must also furnish a current certificate of eligibility in order to bid on this project. The contractor shall at all times provide a force of qualified personnel sufficient, in the opinion of the City, to perform the work and specialized operations required and described herein. A working knowledge will be required in basic electrical circuits, solid –state circuits, D.C. current applications, field-testing equipment, and local and national electrical codes. The City shall be the sole judge as to the qualifications and credentials of the contractor's personnel.

EQUIPMENT:

- A. The CONTRACTOR, in addition to typical tools and equipment including, but not limited to, pickup trucks, line trucks, trailers, backhoe, trenchers, air compressors and other specialized electrical equipment, shall possess a self-propelled bucket truck with a 3M Model 196 High Priority Opticom emitter capable of servicing overhead traffic signals and the City's Emergency Vehicle Priority System.
- B. The CONTRACTOR shall submit hourly expense rates for commonly used machinery and equipment as a part of this contract. The contractor will be paid for the use of machinery or special equipment, the use of which has been authorized by the City and for which there is no unit price in this contract, in accordance with Article 109-04 (b) of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.
- C. The CONTRACTOR shall provide all of his own testing instruments, as required, including a portable M205 Opticom Detector/ 168 Phase Selector test unit to test the City's emergency vehicle emitters at locations designated by the City and to service the electrical traffic control system of the City. All test equipment shall be included in the unit cost for the various pay items in this contract. No additional compensation will be allowed.

SUBCONTRACTS:

Portions of requested servicing may occasionally be required to be performed by subcontract with prior consent of the City Engineer or his duly authorized agents. The contractor shall, prior to performance of the work, submit to the City the name of the subcontractor he intends to utilize. All subcontracting work shall be according to applicable portions of Section 100 of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction.

METHOD OF BILLING:

Separate itemized billing invoices shall be submitted by the contractor for each individual work order. The contractor shall submit an invoice for each work order within two (2) weeks after completion of the work.

The contractor shall submit two (2) copies of each itemized invoice. The invoice shall contain the name of the person requesting service, location of service, invoice number, a detail of the time and cost of labor and equipment and the materials utilized to complete the requested service, a brief description of the service performed and the total cost of the work. A copy of the work order with the date and time the work was completed, and appropriate comments and/or reports shall be attached to each billing invoice.

The contractor shall bill to the nearest half (1/2) unit price utilized in performing the requested service.

Invoices for any work done to repair damage caused by accident or vandalism shall be kept separate from work done as normal maintenance. Also, a note shall be included on the invoice notifying the ENGINEER that this work was done as a result of accident or vandalism.

MATERIALS:

The price charged by the contractor for parts or materials used shall be the contractor's cost plus a nominal fee as bid for indirect expense. Invoices for all materials must accompany all invoices submitted for payment.

WAIVER OF LIEN:

The CITY ENGINEER may at his discretion require Waivers of Lien for materials or authorized subcontracted work prior to payment for any goods or services.

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PROTECTION:

The contractor shall utilize the proper traffic control and protection procedures required by applicable State Standards, to properly protect his workmen and the motoring public, when work is being performed on or near the roadway.

WORK ORDERS:

All work to be performed by the contractor shall be on a call-out basis, normally being initiated with a telephone call from either the Police Department or City Engineer. The caller will indicate the type of facility, location, and a description of the service required or the problem reported.

If at the time the service is being performed, it appears that additional work of a minor nature is needed, the contractor should proceed with that work. If it appears that the additional work could result in a substantial addition or change to the current work order, the contractor shall contact the City before proceeding with the additional work.

The date and time the requested work is completed shall be noted on the copy of the work order, which is returned to the City with the billing invoice.

CONTROL OF WORK:

The City will conduct frequent inspections of the respective systems and installations to determine if the servicing is being performed by the contractor promptly and satisfactorily, and in the manner specified in the contract.

The City reserves the right to place maximum or minimum limits on the work force and /or equipment utilized by the contractor to execute a work order.

RESPONSE TIMES:

The City will attempt to establish an expected response time for the requested service at the time a work order is issued. If, however, the contractor is not given an expected response time, the following times are to apply:

- A. Emergency Service Calls- respond within one hour or less. Emergency Service Calls are defined as dark or malfunctioning traffic signals, knocked down traffic signal, standards or controllers.
- B. Routine Traffic Signal Calls- respond within 24 hours of issuance. It shall be the contractor's responsibility to promptly notify the City, if for any reason, the contractor cannot meet either the response time established at the issuance of the work order, or the response times established herein.
- C. All traffic signal knockdowns are expected to be repaired by the next day, regardless of weekends and holidays. The contractor shall respond within one hour or less to a call to repair a traffic signal knockdown to clear all electrical circuits, pickup the knockdown debris, and ensure that the intersection is either back in normal operation, or in the flashing mode. If the contractor does not have the necessary equipment or is unable to make the necessary knockdown repair the same day, the City shall be notified.

ANCHOR BOLT REPAIRS:

Repairs to broken anchor bolts shall be made using rod couplings of a type and from a manufacturer approved by the Illinois Department of Transportation. The concrete around the broken anchor bolt shall be core drilled and removed to the depth necessary to accommodate the rod coupling. After the coupling is installed, the concrete shall be replaced with grout mixture. Anchor bolts should not be welded.

REPAIR PARTS AND COMPONENTS:

Traffic signal equipment, parts, and components are to be furnished by the CONTRACTOR, unless otherwise specified by the City. The contractor shall be expected to provide miscellaneous electrical items, electrical hardware, fasteners, wire, conduit, tape, and any other material normally associated with the maintenance of electrical devices. When such materials are furnished by the contractor, the material shall be of the best grade of their respective kinds, for the purpose. All materials used should be itemized on the individual billing invoice for that work order.

In order to expedite the repair of an installation, the CITY reserves the right to deliver parts, materials and equipment directly to the contractor's shop or to the job site.

The CONTRACTOR shall make a good faith effort to purchase the materials supplied by them at the best possible price. These materials will be paid for at the rate of actual cost to the contractor plus the percentage noted on the contractor's bid form. Sales receipts or bill of materials may be requested as documentation of material costs.

CONTROLLER SERVICE LOGS:

Entries in service logs in City controller cabinets are to be made by the CONTRACTOR at the time any controller related servicing is performed. The date and time should reflect when the serviceman arrives to begin work on the controller.

TRAFFIC SIGNS:

When repairing a damaged traffic signal or light, the CONTRACTOR shall reinstall any existing traffic signs, which were attached to the standard. If these signs are damaged to the extent they cannot be reused, the CONTRACTOR shall immediately notify the City so that replacement signs can be installed.

JOINT UTILITY LOCATING INFORMATION FOR EXCAVATORS (J.U.L.I.E.)

This work will be done in accordance with Article 107.31 of Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for arranging all locates and will not begin any excavation operations until owners have been notified and performed their locates.

If any of the location markers placed by a utility company conforming to this procedure are eradicated by the operations of the Contractor, or his subcontractors, the Contractor

shall immediately notify the utility owner and shall bear sole responsibility for any cost incurred for the remarking of the locations of the facilities by the utility owner.

Work under this contract is assigned on an "as needed" basis, therefore no information as to specific locations is known at this time. The Contractor will be required to determine the utilities to be located in an area as work is assigned.

LABORERS (NORTH) - The area bounded by Route 159 to a point south of Fairview Heights and west-southwest to Route 3 at Monroe County line.

PLUMBERS & PIPEFITTERS (SOUTHEAST) - That part of the county bordered by Rt. 50 on the North and West including Belleville.

PLUMBERS (NORTHWEST) - Towns of Aloraton, Brooklyn, Cahokia, Caseyville, Centreville, Dupo, East Carondelet, E. St. Louis, Fairview Heights, French Village, National City, O'Fallon, Sauget, and Washington Park.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and Veterans Day in some classifications/counties. EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER AND MARBLE FINISHER

The handling, at the building site, of all sand, cement, tile, marble or stone and all other materials that may be used and installed

by [a] tile layer or marble mason. In addition, the grouting, cleaning, sealing, and mixing on the job site, and all other work as required in assisting the setter. The term "Ceramic" is used for naming the classification only and is in no way a limitation of the product handled. Ceramic takes into consideration most hard tiles.

ELECTRONIC SYSTEMS TECHNICIAN

Installation, service and maintenance of low-voltage systems which utilizes the transmission and/or transference of voice, sound, vision, or digital for commercial, education, security and entertainment purposes for the following: TV monitoring and surveillance, background/foreground music, intercom and telephone interconnect, field programming, inventory control systems, microwave transmission, multi-media, multiplex, radio page, school, intercom and sound burglar alarms and low voltage master clock systems.

Excluded from this classification are energy management systems, life safety systems, supervisory controls and data acquisition systems not intrinsic with the above listed systems, fire alarm systems, nurse call systems and raceways exceeding fifteen feet in length.


