PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Anna Maddox: 1250 Shiloh Station Road. I am here for motion 11-B 6 of the old Schatze's building. Our concern is we are in favor of a business going in, our concern is if the business will have adequate parking to support it.

Patric Slash: 306 Wabash Avenue. We are here today as a concerned citizen, current US Foreign Policy provides direct aid to a regime that is committing crimes against humanity against Palestinians people. These crimes are paid for by tax dollars.

Alderperson Randle: Point of Order your honor.

Patric Slash: It can also be supported by investments of municipal funds and businesses that support and benefit from Israeli genocide, this is - - -

Mayor Gregory: Sir we need to keep these things to the agenda, or City business.

Patric Slash: This is part of the agenda. Municipal Bonds Investment, right? Additionally, the City needs to review its procurement policies to indicate its commitment to ethical standards, something significant about this City Council meeting is how it falls between Memorial Day and Juneteenth. Memorial Day was first started to commemorate fallen soldiers in the Civil War, who fought against a

vicious suppression in the form of slavery. Juneteenth is to commemorate the freedom that they fought for, those soldiers and the ones who came after did not die to export the same inequalities that pervaded through Jim Crow. Behavior like this, not (inaudible) deprived on the National level but also at the State and City level. The beauty of our City and our United States should not come at the expense of civilians foreign or domestic, that is why I support the Emergency Cease Fire Resolution being presented here today. I ask this Council not to be complicit in genocide.

Stewart Lannert: I used to like Belleville until, I have lived in Belleville since 1970, after about fifteen or twenty years I found out if you have a business in Belleville and you are a Republican, the City of Belleville is not going to give you any help at all, they might hinder your business (gavel striking)

Mayor Gregory: Let's stick with the agenda this evening.

Stewart Lannert: I have another thing here this evening, I offered to pay \$60,000 to buy this 75mm French cannon that is rusted out here at Little Devils football and put it in the Walnut Hill Cemetery by the Vietnam Memorial and I was, I thought that the Constitution meant something but today's amendment was totally violated and I was charged with a million dollar bond for a non-violent crime, a million dollar and the City and the County or somebody got \$100,000 of my money (gavel striking)

Mayor Gregory: Stewart, this is not on the agenda.

Stewart Lannert: We had to listen to his tirade about Palestine, whatever they are.

Mayor Gregory: Thank you so much.

Stewart Lannert: I am against the bike trail too.

Chibu Asonye: for Illinois District 13, which covers part of Belleville not all of it. I live in Champaign on 1st Street. I am really here to talk about and share with you thinking about business thinking about the funds I want to highlight that there is part of City business is (inaudible) goes and part of our taxes do go to support the genocide that happens in Gaza at the current moment so I do believe that is the business (inaudible) that you all can discuss and talk about.

Jeffery Dixon: 2303 Rockwood Drive. Same as in the local government is paying tax dollars to the perpetuation of the genocide that is happening to the Palestinian community. I would like to put forth a resolution, a cease fire resolution, to end the killings on both sides, because killing, I believe everybody can agree of humans is wrong in every sense of the word. With that being said, in this emergency cease fire resolution whereas this council condemns violence of any kind and all forms of hate including racism, Islamophobia, antisemitism, and insist that all people have the right to learn, work, worship and live free from the harassment and fear of (inaudible) and whereas this Council has heard from constituents in the City (inaudible) to support those who have been killed or injured in worsening conflict (inaudible) or experiencing famine and devastation who have been personally threatened and fear of violence and whereas this Council condemns the attacks in Israel on October 7, 2023 that lead to the loss of Israeli and American lives and taken hundreds of hostages and whereas this Council and Belleville citizens of all faiths and backgrounds have expressed both profound concern for (inaudible) and more the loss of tens of thousands of innocent Palestinians-American lives into the war in Gaza. Further the Council calls for the International Aid to go immediately and directly to the people of Gaza to help end genocide. Whereas the Council supports all efforts to resolve a tragic conflict in Gaza and further supports the Resolution adopted by the UN Security Council that calls for the halt in fighting in Gaza and put the release of all hostages taken captive on October 7 and whereas the Resolution constitutes an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health and safety now and therefore be absolved by this Council of the City of Belleville section one that this Council (inaudible) all forms of age discrimination in the City around the world supports the United

Nations Security Council Resolution calling for the halt of the genocide in Gaza, section two that the Clerk of Council is directed to send copies of this Resolution to United States House of Representatives, Senator Tammy Duckworth, Governor J.B. Pritzker and President Joe Biden. Section three this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and provided it receives the affirmative vote from the appropriate members of the Council. This shall take effect and be enforced immediately upon this adoption and approved by the Mayor otherwise it should take effect and be enforced from and after the (inaudible) section four and this Council commits to reviewing its City investment portfolio to ensure any municipal funds aren't spent on businesses that support or benefit the existing apartheid regiment in Israel in a process of changing it (inaudible) and policies to reflect a dissolved, disavowed companies or organizations that support or benefit in crimes against humanity

Mayor Gregory: Thank you.

Jeffery Dixon: All I can say that the lives that we have lost in Gaza is 40,000+ and in Belleville you are just over 40,000+ citizens, that is every citizen in Belleville that has been killed. So Mayor, when I ran against you respectfully as (inaudible) you said out of your mouth, that you respect and believe in the racial and social justices efforts that I was pushing for which includes human rights, the killing of 40,000+ people, men, women, and children is wrong (inaudible) this would have been a resolution that I would have passed - - -

Aldersperson Elmore: I just want to throw something out there about six, seven, and eight, the folks that spoke this evening are anxious to speak to the owners as they are the abutting properties, and they would like to open up some kind of conversation about what was previously worked out with Schatze’s and the parking lot. They are open, they are not saying yes or no, they are just open to discussion. I hope the bar owners, if they are here tonight or Economic Development can let these folks know and put them in touch with each other. We have had no objections to this, nobody has spoken against it at Zoning, the only question is it is going to take a lot to bring this property back to life, but it could be a good thing.

Aldersperson Ovian: I didn’t catch this I have only one question, at the location in LE5, request for outdoor dining at 1926 West Main Street are they going to have to require a bump out, because I don’t know if there is going to be one in the back of the property in the front of the property.

Director of Economic Development, Planning & Zoning Cross: So, this actually came up during the ZBA case so, you notice it is out of chronological order, it is down a little way from their actual Liquor License request. When this application was accepted for the Liquor License by the staff we looked at the application for the outdoor dining, when you look at their dining, the way the ordinance is currently written, it talks about needing a Special Use Permit when you have it in a public right-of-way or in a public space. This is technically supposed to go to the rear of the property, so because of the potential of the dining outside in the rear of the property, even though they were not required to do that, we like to bring that before the ZBA so the neighbors can provide public comment as part of the process, it is a little overkill. So, the short answer is this is actually going to go to the rear of the property. We also talked about the potential of something being up front, that is going to be a tall task in that you are going to have to provide some sort of barrier protection up front there as you talked about they just don't know if it is feasible there, if it comes to that point we will evaluate that and bring that back to discuss that, but this is really overkill to make sure that they can have a couple tables out back and just wanted it to be part of the Public Hearing process, we wanted to give the neighbors any public input today. So, this is, it is going in the rear.

Aldersperson Ovian: How will that effect the parking back there, because that is where most of - - -

Director of Economic Development, Planning & Zoning Cross: We did talk about that, so strategically we have to evaluate that, we made it very clear if it takes any of their required parking away, then they cannot have it in the rear. So that will be part of the administrative review process. I also talked about this during the ZBA case, I really am not a fan of how our outdoor dining provisions are written. I want to reevaluate and redo them. Proposed to do them like we did at University City, in University City, here our outdoor dining, in that provision of the code, was really designed for one place and one place only. Really downtown, right? As you walk up and down the sidewalk, you want to make sure you meet with the separation requirements so that you don't have any ADA issues, so I would almost like to make the outdoor area dining is given upon the issuance of annual permit. In other words, every business has to come in every year and pay \$25 permit, show the layout so we can insure the ADA requirements are being met and we don't get a visit from the Attorney General office. I think that is really ideal and then also we must address the in these private businesses that are going to have upward ninety in the rear, most of them are bars and places like that, we require a Special Use Permit, we did an amendment that requires any outdoor establishment with onsite outdoor operations to go through the SUP process as well, that is another reason why we did it like this because it came after the fact. So, it is really overseeing the bands playing at 11:00 p.m. and things like that.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Belleville, Illinois as follows:

Section 1. That the request for the previously approved Special Use Permit for a Liquor License and Outdoor Dining, located at 1112 West Main Street (08-21.0-332-003 & 08-21.0-332-004) located in a "C-2" Heavy Commercial District, is hereby **extended until December 31, 2024.**

Section 2. That conflicting ordinances or pertinent portions thereof in force at the time of this ordinance takes effect are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication, all as provided by law.
