PUBLIC HEARING

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Rick Brown: Belleville. Uh I guess my daughter's right, using the word racist around here doesn't seem to help because nobody cares. So, I'm going to talk about the law. You might remember Mr. Buettner used to be an Alderman here, He got a \$30 000 judgment against you because you tore a sign down. He sent the cops or somebody down to tear a sign down at his business. The law is 18 USC 241 Conspiracy Against Rights. It includes the First Amendment, but it also includes Due Process. Section 241 makes it unlawful for two or more persons to agree to injure, threaten, or intimidate a person uh in the United States in their free exercise or enjoyment of any right or privilege secured by the Constitutional Laws of the United States. The offenses are always a felony. Always. And if the offence is a criminal violation you can get up to 10 years of imprisonment. And if there's aggravating factors like somebody killed themselves being so distraught over uh not getting their Zoning Hearing done that, they killed themselves you could be charged with manslaughter. That's a fact. Okay. Now um the uh yeah uh I so I asked a question is it a violation of 18 USC 2 241 that results in suicide death punishable? Yes, a violation of 18 USC 241 that results in death doesn't mention suicide, but it says death for a reason because that could be brought in now dealing with uh the due process. The due process that you're going to violate tonight when you vote this thing down is that he who votes must see the evidence. None of you saw the evidence except for two Aldermen, and you've got the second due process violation, is that, Mr. uh Johnny Anthony came out and explained to us after the meeting last time a thing called Aldermanic Privilege. You guys in your eight wards get all of the

Aldermanic Privilege. You get to decide all Zoning Cases and everybody else votes with you. That was explained to us. Four witnesses, four witnesses saw this. Johnny Anthony explained how that works. Well, I'd like to vote for you, but I can't. I want stuff in my Ward if I want it done. That is a due process violation. And if you do anything other than approve this tonight all it has to be is a simple majority. I will personally go to the US attorney and the FBI with this. Okay.

Alderman Ovia: What in the hell is he talking about?

Michael Hagberg. I'm going to speak on the amended uh TIF Agreement for Blounts and Moore. In there, if I got all my facts from the documents correct, they are reducing their investment in the property by 20%. Yet they're still going to receive 100% of the requested reimbursement. They're reducing the number of employees being committed in the first year by 30%. Yet they're still going to receive 100% of the requested reimbursement. They're reducing their sales tax commitment by 60%, and yet they still receive 100% of the requested reimbursement. There's also an additional part about them committing to the growing phase of the project. Well, I have to say that when you have verbiage in there that says we will commit to the growing phase before a certain date what does commit mean? Does commit mean that you could have a photo op with a groundbreaking ceremony? Well, we've committed to it so it's good. Nothing actually happens. I'd say that that section should be stricken and reworded to deal with the date of operation of the gross action, something that is substantial. Um I mean we're talking about \$800,000 of taxpayer money that's going to fund this dispensary rather than fixing roads and sidewalks. So, the contract should be a little bit tighter than it is. And also, I noticed that we talked a number of times ago about not doing TIF Agreements with not with it not having the property owner involved in it. One of the things we have is many LLCs. Well, when you have an LLC that's the operation, they have no assets. So, if they default on the agreement then there's no bank account to go after, there's no people to go after, there's no real property that can have a lien placed on it, and the taxpayers end up losing. And if you need any refresher for that there's a current lawsuit dealing with exactly that in the City of Belleville. Um all right. I'll finish up and I'll do the next thing next time. Thank you.

Mayor Gain Meyer: Anyone else? Mr. Brown, you have already had your time.

Rick Brown: I was asked by an Alderman to come up here and talk tonight.

Mayor Gain Meyer: You have already spoken.

Rick Brown: The one that called me a son-of-a-bitch at the last meeting.

Mayor Gain Meyer: Mr. Brown, you have already spoken.

Alderman Ovia: I didn't call him that.

Rick Brown: Somebody did, and it wasn't this guy the one that is not here - -

Mayor Gain Meyer: Mr. Brown - -

Rick Brown: But somebody called me a son-of-a-bitch at the last meeting, and it was caught on a hot mic, you want to hear it?

Mayor Gain Meyer: No, please sit down, you have had your time - -

Rick Brown: It is right here. Well, I am going to show it to the newsman. They have already seen it.

Mayor Gain Meyer: That's fine, please sit down.

Rick Brown: Call my mother a bitch – wow.

Mayor Gain Meyer: Mr. Brown, please sit down.

Kelli Roberts: There are two issues on the agenda that I would like to speak towards. The first one is Ordinance 9439-2025 and that's the zoning for Victoria Martin. I just wanted to say in support of what she is trying to do, that the fact that there are additional people that want to come and visit Belleville I think that that speaks highly of the neighborhood that she's in. And so, her wish and desire to have it as an additional Airbnb, I think that falls in alignment with what's happening on one side of their property which is already being used as an Airbnb. I also think that it gives opportunity for someone who is a young person and really getting her feet into real estate, that this is an excellent opportunity for her to do so. So, I would like for you all to reconsider the zoning request. The next one is in regard to my own zoning request and that's at 224 South Charles Street. And I am so surprised the pitchforks have not come out yet. So, I'm going to go ahead and read this in preparation for them. So that's ordinance number 9443-2025, and I want to say that I'm here tonight to place on record that there have been (inaudible) which were shared about our property at 224 South Charles Street. Specifically, regarding parking and local traffic. My partner and I have used these distortions as an attack on our character, our integrity, and our small business. To begin, we did conduct a minor traffic study in late October after our initial zoning meetings. We were not afforded the opportunity to formally present these findings of the study of that report which states using ITE's trip generation manual 10th edition for apartment multi-family land use small rental projects generate trips on a per dwelling basis. A five-unit residential building with a mix of two two bedrooms, two one bedrooms, and one studio is expected to generate approximately 37 vehicle trips per day, about 7.3 trips per dwelling during the AM peak hours. This equates roughly to two to three trips entering and exiting combined and during PM peak hour three-week three vehicle trips. When compared to nearby connectors and arterial streets that carry several thousand vehicles per day. This additional um this additional traffic represents well under 1% of existing volumes and is considered operationally negligible. Accordingly, the proposed five-unit development is not expected to create any measurable adverse effects on intersection operations, neighborhood traffic conditions, or overall level of service. The next issue we would like to address is parking. The front of our building has over 25 ft of linear parking which allows for two cars. The back of our property has approximately 1500 square ft of parking which allows for five cars. Additionally, just four houses down at 208 North Charles, which like our property shares an alley with Abend there are 1,488 square feet of paved parking and that property is also five units. I present all of this tonight to demonstrate that my partner and I have done our due diligence and that we operate in a spirit of truth and transparency. While this information may not change the vote tonight, we wanted to ensure that the facts about our property at 224 South Charles have been clearly and publicly stated. Thank you and have a good evening.

Victoria Martin: Um I wasn't aware this meeting was happening. Neither of my Alderpeople told me.

Mayor Gain Meyer: You need to state your name.

Victoria Martin: I believe we've all met before. I wasn't aware that this meeting was happening. I thought that my property had been decided on, what was that three weeks ago? So, I'm kind of confused that I had

to hear about this from other people, not from both of my Alderpeople. So why am I here just learning about this now? I would love to speak to this due process because I am so confused about what is going on here. Let me take that back. I'm not confused. I know your buddy Jason set this up. I know that's what's going on. What I would love to know is why this happened two or three weeks ago, and I get blindsided by this entire Council? Everybody voted down my Airbnb when it was approved by the Zoning Commission. I'm just finding this out now, and here I've been foolishly living in Belleville over the last four years paying ridiculous property taxes. Now there was an attack on my character made three weeks ago and I am sorry I didn't have time to prepare a speech or have any sort of consensus. There's an attack on my character as if I'm a bad neighbor. Let me be very clear that that person that you're defending those several neighbors who you won't tell me their names. You won't tell me how many, and the only neighbor who's turned over since I had my Airbnb approved three years ago, I spoke to him 10 minutes ago. He's confused and he says, "No I would love to approve that for you." So, EXPLAIN TO ME WHAT is happening here. This is a crazy thing. I STUDIED ABROAD IN Latin America. That's the kind of THING THAT HAPPENS THERE. NOT IN this country. This is absurd. Now let me give, oh yeah new thoughts. I'm sure. Now I would love to know why neither of my Alderpeople informed me that this meeting was happening tonight despite knowing that I would love to have my Airbnb be improved, so that I could host more service people. I had to turn down service people whose home was burned down and wanted to stay there temporarily while their home is rebuilt. Just a week ago I hosted a returning service person to Scott that I hosted two years ago when he PCFed off. This is insane to me, and we're saying your argument was several neighbors are concerned that it's going to bring dangerous people to the neighborhood. My puppy Airbnb are you out of your mind? We're two BLOCKS FROM SAV ON LIQUOR. I DON'T HEAR YOU COMPLAINING about them. And your argument is we're bringing in people into the neighborhood withers ELEMENTARY SCHOOL. THERE'S ALSO a middle school BUT I FIND IT VERY interesting, you're not concerned about those people, those kids. Now again, I didn't have any time to prepare. I was in the shower half an hour ago, but this is ridiculous. An absolute violation of my due process AND I WOULD LOVE; I WOULD LOVE AN EXPLANATION from both of my Alderpeople and the City Council about why I was not told about this meeting at all. Why three weeks ago I thought this was done?

Rick Brown: It's called Aldermanic Privilege.

Victoria Martin: Yeah exactly. I mean their rules for me not for the right.

Rick Brown: Yeah.

Victoria Martin: I mean, I have three more seconds, but this is, this is appalling.

Mayor Gain Meyer: Alright, anyone else for Public Participation? Okay, we are going to move on.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT & ANNEXATION

Aldersperson Dowling-Urban made a motion second by Aldersperson Stiehl to De-Annex 263 West Taft Street (Parcel #08-28.0-410-023).

Aldersperson Elmore: What generated this? I didn't see anything (inaudible).

Mayor Gain Meyer: Eric can correct me if I am wrong. So their house is in the County, this other parcel has the two outbuildings, and they are wanting to build another outbuilding on it. And obviously with our Zoning Code, it is not allowed on separate parcels, so they are asking to just de-annex that section into the County.

Aldersperson Dowling-Urban made a motion second by Aldersperson Sullivan to approve an amended development agreement with Blounts & Moore Holdings, LLC for remodeling of the existing facility located at 7300 Twin Pyramid Parkway for a cannabis dispensary.

Aldersperson Randle: I was going to ask for Eric to come up and explain the uh revisions to the Development Agreement.

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: Uh this agreement was drafted by previous staff. Uh so I was not involved until recently. Um but the uh, first payment was made, and uh the request for the second payment came through. And when I was uh requesting the documentation uh that's when it was brought to my attention that some of the numbers that were in the original agreement were combined with uh the dispensary and the growers. So, I think that then, yes, there was some confusion whether I don't know whose uh side was on. So, these were the numbers that were provided to me, and the commitment provided to me by Blounts & Moore.

Alderman Randle: So, um excuse me. On the basis of what they told you, they're saying that the numbers originally were based on the fact that there would be both the dispensary and the growth facility?

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: That's my understanding that the investment numbers and the sales numbers and so forth were based on the combination of those two facilities. Both are on the same property, but portion of the building will be used for the dispensary, and another portion will be used for part of the grow center and later on there will be the additional uh expansion of the growth center as well.

Alderman Randle: But they knowingly signed a Development Agreement based upon what was given them and they didn't correct it then?

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: Yes.

Alderman Randle: Yeah, I'm in, I'm inclined not to be in favor of voting for this.

Mayor Gain Meyer: Any other discussion on this?

Alderman Dowling-Urban: I know that there was some discussion. Can you tell us what uh was recommended in terms of disposition of the check? When, if the check was approved, when would it be?

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: It would be of course after all the documentation of the investment was made as well as the issuance of the uh Occupancy Permit.

Alderman Dowling-Urban: So, unlike the previous check that would (inaudible) ensure that it was actually open.

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: That is correct.

Alderman Kaiser: Eric, would you mind sharing the differences, the discrepancies in the original to where we are now?

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: Sure. The investment amount went from 1.8 million to 1.4. The jobs uh was thirty in the first year, but that's been reduced to twenty, and then it'll go to ten in the second year or it was two before. So essentially same number of jobs over two years, and then the 8 to 8.5 million in sales is reduced to 3.5. And this is just for the dispensary.

Aldersperson Elmore: They thought they were combining the dispensary and the growth?

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: Again, I picked this up you know two-thirds of the way down the road, so that's my understanding. I didn't have any discussions.

Aldersperson Elmore: The biggest discrepancy sounds like the last one from eight million to three million and that's the statement that they gave you. Was we thought that was (inaudible)?

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: That was in our discussion, yes. That was when we talked about that 8.5. They said that's when the dispensary and the growth center are both fully open and operation.

Aldersperson Elmore: And now they wanted to change it to three because they're fixing that on the dispensary side.

Aldersperson Dowling-Urban: What is their, what was their intent regarding the growing part of that?

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: That they'll start construction by April 1st of 2026.

Aldersperson Dowling-Urban: If that occurs will those numbers then be more in line with the original numbers that were that were told to us or is there still a significant discrepancy?

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: That's my understanding is that the numbers will be closer to that once the growers up until the operation.

Aldersperson Dowling-Urban: Okay. So, what we're really talking about now is just kind of taking it like stage one and stage two whereas all of them linked together. So that when actually stage one and stage two is accomplished those numbers will be reflected of the original agreement.

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: That is correct.

Aldersperson Schneider: I'm not understanding at all. So, what happens if we vote no on this? Does it go back to the drawing board? I mean- -

Mayor Gain Meyer: It passed out of committee. So, we're going to vote tonight. Yes or no on the development agreement?

Aldersperson Schneider: So, but what if we vote no and a majority is no, it has to go to the first Development Agreement the original? They're not amending it.

Mayor Gain Meyer: It would revert to the original. That's what you're asking?

Aldersperson Schneider: Yes, that is what I am asking. And if they don't uphold their part of the agreement what happens?

City Attorney Hoerner: I mean options. We look at our options at that point, but that's not a subject for open session.

Aldersperson Rothweiler: I think the main issue is time is not Eric? The Development Agreement went through a certain date and then on that date they can't meet that expectation. They've run, I understand, they've run into construction problems in that location due to its former use of that building. So, they had to make adjustments. To do that which has delayed the project from getting going. That's my understanding, at least that's their explanation for it. So, this merely extends the date December 31st if I remember right? Okay. December 31st. The second thing is in the committee we work together to ensure that no more funds go out to them until the doors are open, which would be the Occupancy Permit. So, they're not going to get another check even if they provide the receipts prior to we are open, and we are selling such that we're getting the sales tax revenue off of it before they would get payment from us that the secondary the second payment out of out of the agreement. Correct? Okay, that's some of the safeguards that we talked about in Economic Development to try to make sure that they are open before they do it, and we have a commitment from them by April 1 of 26 to start construction on growth. So, we believe that with those adjustments the agreement would be uh more effective by doing that.

Mayor Gain Meyer: Any other discussion?

Aldersperson Ovian: I'd like to see this tabled tonight because I, in all fairness to the individual who would like to have the event center, I'd like to see what they're paying in terms of this \$80,000 to make sure that everything that's submitted as an expense qualifies for the money that she's receiving. This whole thing has been blown out of proportion. Uh I talked to a roofing contractor just recently, Taylor is a commercial roofing contractor, and he told me, he said Raffi, he said basically it's going to cost based on the dimensions and of the roof and everything and this and the problems associated with it being vacant for almost 20 years it's going to cost at least \$200,000 in order just to do the roof. So, I'd like to see what the total expense for the budget is, and that way we can vote on it if it's, you know, she's talking about \$538,000 money appropriate will be for the cost of the purchase as well as the remodeling. I find that difficult to believe. Thank you.

Aldersperson Anthony: I don't have a problem with uh with it. Um you know it's always been my contention that people that go into these ventures do their due diligence so that they know practically what they're going to spend. And you know I don't want to be legislating what they're

what they what they did. and how much money they got to spend on it. And I discussed this with uh with Raffi. He knows that I want to say this, but um the uh the person that's doing this, you know I mean I have faith that if they're going to put up a half a million dollars, and we're talking about awarding them \$80 000 they're not going to get the \$80,000. We're not going to hand them a check for \$80,000. Uh they got to do the work first. Am I correct in this uh area?

Multiple people saying yes.

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: Yes. So, every agreement that I, that I deal with, that I work with, that I write, or you know uh, have to submit the documentation. I literally go through the number of Home Depot receipts. I've gone through and scratched out the candy bar that they bought when they were in line. You know I spend hours and hours doing that. So yeah, I make sure everything's TIF eligible uh before I've sent anything for processing. And if there's an issue or something missing, I reach out to the other party to the agreement and make sure we get the documentation we need before we do any kind of processing of payment. So, and we also put the language in here that they have the occupancy permit as well.

Aldersperson Anthony: Absolutely. And that's my point. We are this development this Development Agreement is pretty straightforward. We're not going to uh, to do anything. And like I say I can't, I don't know what this lady has in her checkbook. She may have two million she can spend, but a lot of time doing it with these things, um people uh make sure I mean if I'm going to spend half a million dollars, I'm going to make sure that I can do this project. And uh hopefully you know, we pray that that she's able to do it. You know that's all we can do. You know that she can get it done, you know. So, uh that's where I'm at on it. I uh believe in letting them do it. Hey, she says she can do it so let's let her do it.

Aldersperson Dowling-Urban: For me she is the safeguard. In other words, you know people open and close businesses all the time. There are people that have really good ideas about things, and are prudent investors. And there's folks that don't. Um uh our concern needs to be to safeguard the taxpayer dollars, the TIF dollars. And I believe that our uh agreement protects our TIF dollars because she doesn't get the check until there's an occupancy permit, and she's actually able to open the building. So, um so, I think that it is important to understand, that this agreement does protect taxpayer dollars while still allowing the freedom for an entrepreneur to try and open business in.

Director of Grants & Special Projects, Eric Schauster: And every agreement right below the responsibilities of the developer, is the penalty section where they have to meet every item within their area or else there are penalties associated.

Mayor Gain Meyer: Anyone else?

SCI Engineering, Inc. (SCI) is pleased to submit this proposal for environmental consulting services at the above-referenced site. The subject property consists of a portion of State Street starting from just north of West Van Buren Street to just south of Lake Shore Drive in Belleville, Illinois.

SCI completed a Preliminary Environmental Site Assessment for this project dated June 10, 2025. RECs were identified at the following sites along the project:

- Site 1: Potential urban fill
- Site 2: Historical automotive repair operations, potential fill material of unknown origin, and potential urban fill
- Site 3: Potential urban fill, potential fill material of unknown origin
- Site 5: Potential railroad ballast, potential urban fill
- Site 7: Potential fill material of unknown origin, potential urban fill

SCI understands that the project will avoid impact to Sites 5 and 7 as construction activities are not proposed in those areas. Furthermore, SCI understands that the project will also avoid impacts to Sites 1 and 2 as only resurfacing activities are planned for those portions of the project area. Therefore, this scope of work does not include further investigation on Sites 1, 2, 5, or 7. The purpose of this scope of work is to evaluate the potential presence of large-scale impact to the soil and groundwater within the limits of construction of the planned intersection improvements due to the conditions identified above on Site 3.

SCOPE OF SERVICE

For the purpose of this proposal, SCI has identified four key project elements. The elements are listed below and detailed in the following sections:

- Soil Sampling
- Groundwater Sampling

- Analytical Testing
- Formal Report

Soil Sampling

SCI will advance seven borings on the project area. Specifically, these borings are proposed where excavations are planned for installation of a sanitary sewer within the right-of-way on the easter side of State Street.

All of the locations will be performed off existing pavement to eliminate the need for lane closures and increase safety. Limited traffic control using signs and cones is anticipated to perform this exploration.

A Geoprobe system will be used to hydraulically drive 2½-inch diameter stainless steel probes to the maximum anticipated depth of construction at each location. Based on the plans provided by Oates Associates dated February 11, 2025, SCI anticipates the maximum depth of construction to facilitate installation of the storm sewer is 6 feet below ground surface.

Soil samples will be continuously collected throughout the depth of probe advancement. Soil samples will be retrieved using a closed-point type, large bore sampler assembly which requires a 2½-inch diameter by 4-foot long soil core in an acetate sleeve sample liner.

Each soil sample retrieved will be screened on approximate 2-foot vertical intervals using a photo-ionization detector (PID). This PID is capable of detecting variations in concentrations of various organic trace gases, including aromatic petroleum hydrocarbons. This sampling protocol and subsequent screening process will aid in determining the vertical extent of soil impact, if present.

One soil sample will be submitted from each boring for laboratory analysis. If fill materials are present, a sample of these materials will be submitted for laboratory analysis. The soil sample with the highest PID reading will be chosen for analytical testing. If no PID reading is encountered, a sample from the approximate center of the proposed excavation depth will be submitted for analysis at each respective boring location.

Each soil sample will be placed into laboratory provided containers and transported under proper chain-of-custody procedures to the laboratory in chilled containers.

Decontamination procedures will consist of washing all sampling equipment in a solution of tap water and laboratory grade detergent (liquinox) followed by tap water rinse and double rinse with distilled water.

As part of the proposed scope, SCI will notify JULIE to locate public utilities. You will be responsible to locate all private utilities or structures. As such, SCI will not be responsible for damage to any unmarked or unknown utilities or structures.

Groundwater Sampling

When the targeted soil boring depth is reached at each of the borings, a piezometer will be installed, if groundwater is encountered. The piezometers will be constructed of a Schedule 40 PVC (polyvinyl chloride) riser and screen. The screened interval is anticipated to be 10-slot (0.010-inch) for a 10-foot interval.

SCI will collect a water sample at the time of piezometer installation. As soon as the water sample is collected, the piezometers will be removed and the remaining void space will be filled with bentonite. The surface will be repaired as appropriate.

A representative groundwater sample will be collected from the piezometer with a disposable polyethylene bailer. Water samples will be placed in laboratory provided containers and transported to the laboratory in chilled containers using proper chain-of-custody procedures.

Analytical Testing

Analytical test parameters for the soil and groundwater samples collected from the subject site will be analyzed for the constituents outlined in Table 2. As discussed above groundwater samples will only be collected from the site if groundwater is encountered within the proposed maximum depth of construction.

If exceedances of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency Maximum Allowable Concentrations of Chemical Constituents in Uncontaminated Soil Used as Fill Material at Regulated Fill Operations (MACs) (35 Ill. Adm. Code 1100.Subpart F) are identified, SCI may recommend that the samples also be analyzed for toxicity characteristic leachate procedure (TCLP) RCRA metals by USEPA Method 1311/6010.

Formal Report

Results of the scope of work outlined in this proposal will be reviewed by the project manager. SCI's findings and recommendations will be presented in a formal report. The report will include a description of sampling methods, laboratory data, a site plan, and all supporting data.

ESTIMATED SCHEDULE

SCI will require five to six weeks from authorization to complete the project. Preliminary results will be available three weeks after sample submittal to the laboratory and the report will be completed two weeks later. However, for the additional fee outlined below, SCI can initiate a rapid turn-around assessment of the site, allowing for issuance of a formal report within two to three weeks from authorization (report status can be relayed by letter as available). If you elect this option, please make a notation on the preferred processing section below.

SERVICE FEE AND SCHEDULE





TERMS & CONDITIONS

January 1, 2019

1. STANDARD OF PERFORMANCE

The standard of care for all professional engineering, consulting and related services performed or furnished by ENGINEER and its employees under this Agreement will be the care and skill ordinarily used by members of ENGINEER's profession practicing under the same or similar circumstances at the same time and in the same locality. ENGINEER makes no warranties, express or implied, under this Agreement or otherwise, in connection with ENGINEER's services.

2. INSURANCE

ENGINEER agrees to procure and maintain, at its expense, Workers' Compensation insurance as required by statute; Employer's Liability of \$250,000; Automobile Liability insurance of \$1,000,000 combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage covering all vehicles, including hired vehicles, owned and non-owned vehicles; Commercial General Liability insurance of \$500,000 per claim for protection against claims arising out of the performance of services under this Agreement caused by negligent acts, errors, or omissions for which ENGINEER is legally liable. Upon request, CLIENT/OWNER shall be made an additional insured on Commercial General and Automobile Liability insurance policies and certificates of insurance will be furnished to the CLIENT/OWNER. ENGINEER agrees to indemnify CLIENT/OWNER for the claims covered by ENGINEER's insurance.

3. OPINIONS OF PROBABLE COST (COST ESTIMATES)

Any opinions of probably project cost or probable construction cost provided by ENGINEER are made on the basis of information available to ENGINEER and on the basis of ENGINEER's experience and qualifications, and represents its judgment as an experienced and qualified professional. However, since ENGINEER has no control over the cost of labor, materials, equipment or services furnished by others, or over the contract(s)' methods of determining prices, or over competitive bidding or market conditions, ENGINEER does not guarantee that proposals, bids or actual project or construction cost will not vary from opinions of probable cost ENGINEER prepares.

4. CONSTRUCTION PROCEDURES

ENGINEER's observation or monitoring portions of the work performed under construction contracts shall not relieve the contractor from its responsibility for performing work in accordance with applicable contract documents. ENGINEER shall not control or have charge of, and shall not be responsible for, construction means, methods, techniques, sequences, procedures of construction, health or safety programs or precautions connected with the work and shall not manage, supervise, control or have charge of construction. ENGINEER shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of the contractor or other parties on the project. ENGINEER shall be entitled to review all construction contract documents and to require that no provisions extend the duties or liabilities of ENGINEER beyond those set forth in this Agreement. CLIENT/OWNER agrees to include ENGINEER as an indemnified party in CLIENT/OWNER's construction contracts for the work, which shall protect ENGINEER to the same degree as CLIENT/OWNER. Further, CLIENT/OWNER agrees that ENGINEER shall be listed as an additional insured under the construction contractor's liability insurance policies.

5. CONTROLLING LAW

This Agreement is to be governed by the law of the state of Illinois or if agreed in writing with CLIENT/CLIENT/OWNER where ENGINEER'S services are performed.

6. SERVICES AND INFORMATION

CLIENT/OWNER will provide all criteria and information pertaining to CLIENT/OWNER's requirements for the project, including design objectives and constraints, space, capacity and performance requirements, flexibility and expandability, and any budgetary limitations. CLIENT/OWNER will also provide copies of any CLIENT/OWNER-furnished Standard Details, Standard Specifications, or Standard Bidding Documents which are to be incorporated into the project. CLIENT/OWNER will furnish the services of soils/geotechnical engineers or other consultants that include reports and appropriate professional recommendations when such services are deemed necessary by ENGINEER. The CLIENT/OWNER agrees to bear full responsibility for the technical accuracy and content of CLIENT/OWNER-furnished documents and services.

In performing professional engineering, construction management, and related services hereunder, it is understood by CLIENT/OWNER that ENGINEER is not engaged in rendering any type of legal, insurance or accounting services, opinions or advice. Further, it is the CLIENT/OWNER's sole responsibility to obtain the advice of an attorney, insurance counselor or accountant to protect the CLIENT/OWNER's legal and financial interests. To that end, the CLIENT/OWNER agrees that CLIENT/OWNER or the CLIENT/OWNER's representative will examine all studies, reports, sketches, drawings, specifications, proposals and other documents, opinions or advice prepared or provided by ENGINEER, and will obtain the advice of an attorney, insurance counselor or other consultant as the CLIENT/OWNER deems necessary to protect the CLIENT/OWNER's interests before CLIENT/OWNER takes action or forebears to take action based upon or relying upon the services provided by ENGINEER.

7. SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS

CLIENT/OWNER and ENGINEER, respectively, bind themselves, their partners, successors, assigns, and legal representatives to the covenants of this Agreement. Neither CLIENT/OWNER nor ENGINEER will assign, sublet, or transfer and interest in this Agreement or claims arising therefrom without the written consent of the other.

8. RE-USE OF DOCUMENTS

All documents, including all reports, drawings, specifications, computer software or other items prepared or furnished by ENGINEER pursuant to this Agreement, are instruments of service with respect to the project. ENGINEER retains ownership of all such documents. CLIENT/OWNER may retain copies of the documents for its information and reference in connection with the project; however, none of the documents are intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by CLIENT/OWNER or others on extensions of the project or on any other project. Any reuse without written verification or adaptation by ENGINEER for the specific purpose intended will be at CLIENT/OWNER's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to ENGINEER, and CLIENT/OWNER will define, indemnify and hold harmless ENGINEER from all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including attorney's fees, arising or resulting therefrom. Any such verification or adaptation will entitle ENGINEER to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by CLIENT/OWNER and ENGINEER.

9. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

CLIENT/OWNER or ENGINEER may terminate the Agreement, in whole or in part, by giving no less than ten (10) business days written notice, if the other party substantially fails to fulfill its obligations under the Agreement through no fault of the terminating party. Furthermore, CLIENT/OWNER may terminate this Agreement for its convenience and without cause by giving no less than ten (10) business days written notice to ENGINEER. Where the method of payment is "lump sum," time & material, or cost reimbursement, the final invoice will include all services and expenses associated with the project up to the effective date of termination plus a fifteen percent fee mark-up for the final invoice amount. An equitable adjustment shall also be made to provide for termination settlement costs ENGINEER incurs as a result of commitments that had become agreed upon before termination, and for a reasonable profit for services performed.

10. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this agreement is held invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall be valid and binding upon the parties. One or more waivers by either party of any provision, term or condition shall not be construed by the other party as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same provision, term or condition.

11. INVOICES

ENGINEER will submit invoices for services rendered and CLIENT/OWNER will make prompt payments in response to ENGINEER's invoices. ENGINEER will retain receipts for reimbursable expenses in general accordance with rules pertaining to the support of expenditures for income tax purposes. Receipts will be available for inspection by CLIENT/OWNER's auditors upon request.

If CLIENT/OWNER disputes any items in ENGINEER's invoice for any reason, including the lack of supporting documentation, CLIENT/OWNER may temporarily delete the disputed item and pay the remaining amount of the invoice, so as not to hold payment. CLIENT/OWNER will promptly notify ENGINEER of the dispute and request clarification and/or correction. After any dispute has been settled, ENGINEER will include the disputed item on a subsequent, regularly scheduled invoice, or on a special invoice for the disputed item only.

CLIENT/OWNER recognizes that late payment of invoices results in extra expenses for ENGINEER; ENGINEER retains the right to assess CLIENT/OWNER interest at the rate of one percent (1%) per month, but not to exceed the maximum rate allowed by law, on invoices which are not paid within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of the invoice. In the event undisputed portions of ENGINEER's invoices are not paid when due, ENGINEER also reserves the right, after seven (7) business days prior written notice, to suspend the performance of its services until all past due amounts have been paid in full.

12. CHANGES

The parties agree that no change or modification to the Agreement, or Task Order, or any attachments hereto, shall have any force or effect unless the change is reduced to writing, dated, and made part of the Task Order. The execution of the change shall be authorized and signed in the same manner as this Agreement. Adjustments in the period of services and in compensation shall be in accordance with applicable paragraphs and sections of the Task Order. Any proposed fees by ENGINEER are estimates to perform the services required to complete the project as ENGINEER understands it to be defined. For those projects involving conceptual or process development services, activities often are not fully definable in the time of performance and compensation scope and adjustments to the time of performance and compensation can be made as required. If such change, additional services, or suspension of services results in an increase or decrease in the cost of or time required for performance of the services, and equitable adjustment shall be made, and the Task Order modified accordingly.

13. CONTROLLING AGREEMENT

These Terms and Conditions shall take precedence over any inconsistent or contradictory provisions contained in any proposal, contract, purchase order, requisition, notice-to-proceed, or like document or Task Order.

14. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT AND NONDISCRIMINATION

In connection with the services under the Agreement, ENGINEER agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of federal and state Equal Employment Opportunity, and other employment, statutes and regulations.

15. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS

CLIENT/OWNER represents to ENGINEER that, to the best of its knowledge, no hazardous materials are present at the project site. However, in the event hazardous materials are known to be present, CLIENT/OWNER represents that to the best of its knowledge it has disclosed to ENGINEER the existence of all such hazardous materials, including but not limited to asbestos, PCB's, petroleum, hazardous waste, or radioactive material located at or near the project site, including type, quantity and location of such hazardous materials. It is acknowledged by both parties that ENGINEER's scope of services do not include services related in any way to encounters undisclosed hazardous materials, ENGINEER shall have the obligation to notify CLIENT/OWNER and, to the extent required by law or regulation, the appropriate governmental officials, and ENGINEER may, at its option and without liability for delay, consequential or any other damages to CLIENT/OWNER, suspend performance of services on that portion of the project affected by hazardous materials until CLIENT/OWNER: (i) retains appropriate specialist consultant(s) or contractor(s) to identify and, as appropriate, abate, remediate, or remove the hazardous materials; and (ii) warrants that the project site is in full compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

CLIENT/OWNER acknowledges that ENGINEER is performing professional services for CLIENT/OWNER and that ENGINEER is not and shall not be required to become an "arranger," "operator," "generator," or "transporter" of hazardous materials, as defined in the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1990 (CERCLA), which are or may be encountered at or near

the project site in connection with ENGINEER's services under this Task Order. If ENGINEER's services hereunder cannot be performed because of the existence of hazardous materials, ENGINEER shall be entitled to terminate this Task Order for cause on 30 calendar days written notice. To the fullest extent permitted by law, CLIENT/OWNER shall indemnify and hold harmless ENGINEER, its officers, directors, partners, employees, and subconsultants from and against all costs, losses, and damages (including but not limited to all fees and charges of engineers, architects, attorneys, and other professionals, and all court or arbitration or other dispute resolution costs) caused by, arising out of or resulting from hazardous materials, provided that (i) any such cost, loss, or damage is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, or death, or injury to or destruction of tangible property (other than completed Work), including the loss of use resulting there from, and (ii) nothing in this paragraph shall obligate CLIENT/OWNER to indemnify any individual or entity from and against the consequences of that individual's or entity's sole negligence or willful misconduct.

16. EXECUTION

This Agreement and subsequent changes, including the exhibits and schedules made part hereof, constitute the entire agreement between ENGINEER and CLIENT/OWNER, supersedes and controls over all prior written or oral understandings. This agreement may be amended, supplemented or modified only by a written instrument duly executed by the parties.

17. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

ENGINEER's and its employees' total liability to CLIENT/OWNER for any loss or damage, including but not limited to special and consequential damages arising out of or in connection with the performance of services or any other cause, including ENGINEER's and its employees' professional negligent acts, errors, or omissions, shall not exceed \$3,000,000, and CLIENT/OWNER hereby releases and holds harmless ENGINEER and its employees from any liability above such amount.

18. LITIGATION SUPPORT

In the event ENGINEER is required to respond to a subpoena, government inquiry or other legal process related to the services in connection with a legal or dispute resolution proceeding to which ENGINEER is not a party, CLIENT/OWNER shall reimburse ENGINEER for reasonable costs in responding and compensate ENGINEER at its then standard rates for reasonable time incurred in gathering information and documents and attending depositions, hearings, and trial.

19. UTILITY LOCATION

If underground sampling/testing is to be performed, a utility locating service shall be contracted to make arrangements for all utilities to determine the location of underground utilities. In addition, CLIENT/OWNER shall notify ENGINEER of the presence and location of any underground utilities located on the CLIENT/OWNER's property which are not the responsibility of other private/public utilities. ENGINEER shall take reasonable precautions to avoid damaging underground utilities that are properly marked. The CLIENT/OWNER agrees to waive any claim against ENGINEER and will indemnify and hold ENGINEER harmless from any claim of liability, injury or loss caused by or allegedly caused by ENGINEER's damaging of underground utilities that are not properly marked or are not called to ENGINEER's attention prior to beginning the underground sampling/testing.

20. ESCALATION

Annual rate escalation of 6% effective January 1, 2017.

21. LIMITATION OF DESIGN ALTERNATIVES

The ENGINEER will limit the number of design alternatives provided under this contract to three, upon which time the design will be considered complete.

22. GRAPHICS CONTROL

Because of its standing as a professional design firm, the ENGINEER has complete control over graphic content and presentation of all studies, reports, and all other documents produced under this agreement.

This Licensed Program Maintenance Agreement (this "Agreement") is made as of the date set forth above (the "Effective Date") by and between Jano Technologies, Inc., ("JANO"), with its principal office located at 415 Devonshire, Champaign, IL 61820, and the City of Belleville Illinois ("Customer"), with its principal office located at 720 W Main St, Belleville, IL 62220

RECITALS:

Whereas, JANO and the Customer intend that JANO shall provide software maintenance and support services for the CLERICUS MAGNUS software product

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and agreements contained herein, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt, sufficiency, and adequacy of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

1. **Definitions.** This Agreement describes the services, fees and procedure whereby JANO will provide the Program Maintenance Services (as defined hereafter) to the Customer. In this Agreement, the following terms shall have the following meanings. Capitalized terms used, but not defined, herein shall have the respective meanings ascribed to them in the software license agreement.

a. **Licensed Program(s).** The term "Licensed Programs" or "Licensed Program" refers to the JANO computer program, including both source code and object code, commonly known as CLERICUS MAGNUS Integrated Justice Information System which is incorporated herein by this reference, including both the standard and optional features therein, that has been provided to and for the benefit of the Customer and its Affiliates.

b. **Associated Documentation.** The term "Associated Documentation" refers to any written materials relating to any Licensed Program, including, without limitation, installation instructions, operating service manuals, and training materials provided by JANO in connection with any Licensed Program.

c. **Software.** The term "Software" refers to the Licensed Programs and Associated Documentation, and any corrections, modifications, additions, revisions, or enhancements of the Licensed Programs and Associated Documentation, that are provided to the Customer pursuant to this Agreement or the Software License Agreement.

2. **Program Maintenance Services.** The following program maintenance services shall be provided by JANO under this Agreement (collectively, the "Program Maintenance Services"):

a. **Licensed Program Services:** JANO will attempt to duplicate any problem the Customer is having, and, if the problem is caused by a defect in the Software, JANO will promptly correct or provide a reasonable bypass for the defect. A "defect" is defined as any problem in the Software which causes it to deviate from the specifications and the warranties for such Software set forth in the Software License Agreement. A "reasonable bypass" is a temporary workaround that provides substantially all of the previously-existing functionality and features of the Software without involving any material increase in time, resources, or effort on the part of the Customer or its Affiliates, or any material degradation in performance of the Software. Corrections of defects will be made by JANO through distribution of Software fixes, either on magnetic media or via electronic customer support (as described below). Cumulative defect corrections will be included with new Software releases when such releases are distributed. The Customer agrees to provide JANO with reasonable access to any of the Customer's computers, or to any of its information technology personnel, as needed and as reasonably requested, to assist JANO personnel in ascertaining the nature and extent of the problem and in determining possible solutions. JANO shall provide reasonable methods by which the Customer's designated contact persons shall report problems or apparent defects with the Software (including providing a toll-free telephone number, a facsimile number, an email address, and the URL of a World-Wide Web site through which problem reports may be submitted). Upon receiving the report of any problem, JANO shall immediately assign appropriately qualified personnel and begin diligent efforts to determine the cause of, and to promptly resolve, such problem. JANO shall continuously use its best efforts to resolve critical problems (i.e., those in which all or a substantial portion of the functionality of a Licensed Program or the System is unavailable for use by a significant number of the Customer's or its Affiliates end-users) within eight (8) hours after such problem was reported. JANO shall use all commercially reasonable efforts to resolve non-critical problems within two (2) days, or as soon as commercially reasonable given the nature and extent of the impact of such problem upon the Customer and its Affiliates. JANO shall keep the Customer reasonably updated as to the status of all

reported, but unresolved, problems. Failure by JANO to resolve problems consistent with this paragraph will result in a material breach of this agreement

b. Licensed Program Releases. From time to time, updates and releases of the Licensed Programs will be distributed by JANO to its customers (including the Customer) and shall include, but shall not be limited to, new features, performance improvements, cumulative corrections or fixes, revisions, or enhancements that have been made to the Software since the last release or initial installation (each such update or release, a "Program Release"). JANO shall make available to the Customer any Program Releases necessary for the Customer to maintain compatibility with the most current releases and versions of the underlying operating system and database software (and the most current fixes and patches to such releases and versions) within a reasonable amount of time after such releases, versions, fixes, or patches become generally and commercially available to the licensed users of such software. The Customer shall be offered each Program Release by JANO at approximately the same time that such Program Release is made generally available to JANO's other customers. The Customer shall have the right, but not the obligation, to install any such Program Release. Installation of a Program Release is the Customer's responsibility. If the Customer has made modifications or additions to the Licensed Programs, JANO cannot be responsible for the successful installation of any Program Release, or for the correct operation, in conjunction with the new release, of any change or addition the Customer has made. Program Releases must be installed within 180 days after JANO makes the release generally available to its customers (including the Customer). JANO assumes no responsibility for any Licensed Program defects contained in prior Program Releases in the event that a new Program Release has been made available by JANO but is not installed by the Customer within such 180 day time period, and JANO cannot guarantee that hotline questions regarding such prior Program Releases will be properly or correctly answered. To the extent consistent with the foregoing provisions of this paragraph, each party shall reasonably cooperate with the other with respect to the Customer's migrating to new releases and versions of operating system or database software (or fixes and patches to such releases and versions) and each party shall use commercially reasonable efforts to keep the other party reasonably well-informed, both prior to and following any such migrations, regarding any problems that might reasonably be anticipated and any problems actually encountered.

c. Telephone Hotline Support: Telephone Hotline Support shall be provided to the Customer during JANO's normal business hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Central time (whether standard or daylight time, as applicable), Monday through Friday. The Customer agrees to follow any reasonable hotline guidelines, as disseminated by JANO to the Customer, from time to time, reasonably in advance of when such guidelines take effect. For example, JANO asks that the Customer inform the JANO operator that the Customer's call is a hotline call for a particular Licensed Program (giving its name). Telephone Hotline Support includes, but is not limited to, application support and problem resolution for all Licensed Programs, answering "how to" questions, and responding to general inquiries.

d. Electronic Customer Support: Electronic Customer Support is provided by JANO by electronically connecting the JANO computer to the Customer's computer via communication line, allowing JANO to remotely troubleshoot problems and distribute Software fixes to the Customer electronically. In order to utilize this Electronic Customer Support, the Customer is required to have, at the Customer's expense, communications support (hardware, system software, and a telephone connection) that is compatible with JANO, the specifications of which shall be promptly provided to the Customer in writing upon request. The Customer must authorize JANO to establish this service and, once authorized, JANO shall promptly establish such service. The parties shall jointly establish the reasonable security ground rules that will be followed. For example, JANO shall be required to obtain the Customer's written approval to view or change the Customer's or its Affiliates' data files while performing on-line troubleshooting or corrections. The Customer may be subject to pay other charges reasonably incurred by JANO in providing electronic customer support. Such charges will be itemized and billed to the Customer monthly, as provided for in this Agreement.

e. Licensed Program Currency: When an entity other than the Customer or any of its Affiliates, or a change in applicable laws or regulations, requires a change to be made in a data file layout or a report, or some other change to existing Licensed Program functionality, JANO will promptly make the necessary modifications to the Licensed Programs to comply with those required changes. Modifications necessitated by changes applicable laws or regulations, or by changes required by a regulatory agency, shall be made without charge. When changes are required by the Customer or any of its Affiliates and those changes require modifications to existing Licensed Program functionality, JANO will make the specified changes according to a separately agreed-to Services Agreement, and will charge the customer the standard JANO hourly rate for development efforts needed to make the change.

3. **Fees, Invoicing and Payment.** The Customer agrees to pay all undisputed invoiced amounts, according to the terms specified in this Agreement. The total amount due will be paid in several installments for each module according to the following schedule:

Payment annually at contract renewal date:
\$39.20 per month per concurrent user
12 concurrent users
\$5,644.80 annual charge

This charge may be adjusted on a monthly basis, if additional concurrent users are added.

All payments shall be made in accordance with the Illinois Local Government Prompt Payment Act, as amended (50 ILCS 505/1 *et seq*)

4. **Miscellaneous.** Each party agrees that: (a) it shall not use the other party's name trademarks, trade names, service marks, logos, or other designations in any promotion or publication without the other party's prior written consent (and specifically with regard to JANO, JANO shall not reflect or represent in any promotion or publication that the Customer or any of its Affiliate approve of, or advocate the use of, the Software, without the Customer's prior written consent); (b) all information provided by the other party (and with respect to the Customer, its Affiliates) that could reasonably be considered confidential shall be kept in strict confidence and shall not be disclosed to any third party without the third party signing a reasonable confidentiality agreement; (c) it will notify the other party of any breach of this Agreement and allow the other party a reasonable opportunity (not more than thirty (30) days) to cure any such breach and comply with the terms hereof before it claims that the other party has breached any of its obligations under this Agreement; and (d) if any legal action is taken or initiated as a result of this Agreement, all costs of that legal action, including reasonable legal fees, will be paid by the non-prevailing party. For purposes of this Agreement, the prevailing party that would be entitled to such reimbursement would be defined as a party who has recovered 75% or more of damages sought by the party.

5. **The Customer's Responsibilities.** The Customer agrees: (a) to provide JANO with reasonable access to the Customer's facilities as necessary for JANO to fulfill its obligations, and if the Customer becomes aware of any reasonably unsafe conditions, or hazardous materials, to which JANO personnel would be exposed at any of the Customer's facilities, the Customer agrees to promptly notify JANO; and (b) to appoint a contact person for the Customer and one for each of its Affiliates, which contact persons shall have completed all the appropriate JANO training, and who, upon JANO's reasonable request, will disseminate JANO's instructions or corrections throughout the Customer's organization.

6. **Term and Termination.**

At the expiration of the Initial Maintenance Period (as defined on the first page of this Agreement), the agreement will automatically renew for an additional one year term. Either party has the right to not-renew this agreement within 60 days of anniversary of the maintenance agreement.

If increases in maintenance fees are required, JANO shall give the Customer sixty (60) days written notice prior to the expiration of the Initial Maintenance Period and of each Renewal Maintenance Period, of its intent to seek a change in the applicable annual maintenance fee. Any such change in the annual maintenance fee for Renewal Maintenance Periods shall be negotiated by the parties in good faith, and shall reflect a fair and reasonable fee based on the customary and prevailing rates for similar services in the software industry. In no event shall any such change result in greater than a six percent (6%) increase in any twelve (12) month period following the Initial Maintenance Period, not including the impact of upgrades as specified in paragraph 7 below.

Either party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days written notice only if the other party is in material breach of any of the terms of this Agreement, provided the breaching party is given prior written notice thereof and reasonable time (not to exceed thirty (30) days) to cure such breach. In the case of a material breach of this agreement, and Customer terminates the agreement, no additional payments, penalties and/or early termination charges shall be required.

In the unlikely event that JANO, or any of its successors or assignees, ceases offering the Program Maintenance Services, the Customer shall have the right to obtain from JANO, or its successors or representatives acting on behalf of JANO, such documentation as JANO shall have for, and immediate access to, the Software's source code so that the Customer may maintain its normal use of, and may modify as necessary, the Licensed Programs. Such documentation and source code shall be licensed to the Customer without additional charge, in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth in the Software License Agreement. In the event that Customer terminates the agreement, no additional payments, penalties and/or early termination charges shall be required.

7. **Upgrade Impact on Maintenance Fees.** In the event that, during the term of this agreement, the Licensed Programs are upgraded via purchases of ad-hoc new software features or via custom programming under a separate written agreement between the parties, that separate written agreement may include fees for software maintenance for that new program code only. Those fees, if applicable, will apply for maintenance during the term of this maintenance agreement, and any Renewal Maintenance Period (as defined above) may be negotiated in good faith to include yearly maintenance fees to include this new, additional software.

8. **Assignment.** Neither party shall assign or in any other manner transfer or convey this Agreement, or any rights, duties, or obligations under this Agreement, without the prior written consent of the other party.

9. **Amendment.** This Agreement may be amended only in a writing signed by both JANO and the Customer.

10. **Applicable Law and Venue.** This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with, and any and all disputes arising out of or in connection with this Agreement shall be governed by, the laws of the State of Illinois, without regard to conflict of laws provisions thereof. In the event any party commences any legal or equitable action or proceeding to enforce the provisions of this Agreement, or to seek damages as a result of the breach of this Agreement, such action or proceeding shall be brought in a state court in the State of Illinois or in the United States District Court for the Central District of Illinois, and each of the parties hereby expressly consents to the jurisdiction of such courts over themselves and the subject matter of such actions or proceedings.

11. **Relationship of the Parties.** The parties acknowledge and agree that JANO is an independent contractor. The personnel of one party shall not in any way be considered agents or employees of the other. To the extent provided for by law, each party shall be responsible for the acts of its own employees. Each party shall be responsible for Workers' Compensation coverage for its own personnel. Further, JANO represents that it has complied, and warrants that it shall comply, with all federal, state and local laws and regulations regarding business permits and licenses that may be required for its performance under this Agreement and JANO warrants that it shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations in its performance under this Agreement.

12. **Confidentiality of the Customer Information.** JANO acknowledges that it may have access to confidential information of the Customer and its Affiliates because of its access to the Customer's and its Affiliates' records and facilities. JANO shall not use or review any written or verbal information which, by its nature and under the circumstances is confidential, including, but not limited to, information in court files (such as name, addresses, and nature of the matter), and any other information the Customer or its Affiliates deems confidential and notifies JANO of same. JANO shall in no event disclose any information as to which disclosure is prohibited by applicable law. In the event that JANO becomes aware of an unauthorized use, reproduction or disclosure of Customer's confidential data, JANO agrees (a) to promptly notify Customer of the unauthorized use, reproduction or disclosure and (b) take all steps reasonably necessary to assist Customer in retrieving Customer's data.

19. JANO agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Customer including their past, present, and future board members, elected officials, insurers, employees, and agents from and against claims, liabilities, obligations, losses, penalties, fines, damages, and expenses and costs relating thereto, including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees and other legal expenses, which Customer may sustain, incur or be required to pay arising out of JANO's performance or failure to adequately perform its obligations pursuant to this Agreement.

20. The parties executing this agreement represent and warrant that they have the authority to execute the agreement and the authority to provide the services contained herein.

21. JANO, its officers, employees, and agents agree not to commit unlawful discrimination and agree to comply with all applicable provisions of the Illinois Human Rights Act, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Age Discrimination in Employment Act, Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act, and all applicable rules and regulations.

22. All services to be undertaken by JANO shall be carried out by competent and properly trained personnel of JANO to the highest standards and to the satisfaction of Customer. All services, materials and components shall conform to relevant manufacturers' and equipment suppliers' specifications, and all materials and spare parts shall be obtained from the original equipment manufacturers or from suppliers approved by them. No warranties implied or explicit may be waived or denied.

23. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts (including facsimile signatures), each of which shall be deemed to be an original and both of which shall constitute one and the same Agreement.

24. In the event Customer is in default under the Agreement because funds are not appropriated for a fiscal period subsequent to the one in which the Agreement was entered into which are sufficient to satisfy all or part of the Customer's obligations under this Agreement during said fiscal period, the Customer agrees to provide prompt written notice of said occurrence to JANO.

25. Neither party will be responsible to the other for damage, loss, injury, or interruption of work if the damage, loss, injury, or interruption of work is caused solely by conditions that are beyond the reasonable control of the parties, and without the intentional misconduct or negligence, of that party (hereinafter referred to as a "force majeure event"). To the extent not within the control of either party, such force majeure events include: acts of God, acts of any governmental authorities, fire, explosions or other casualties, vandalism, and riots or war. A party claiming a force majeure event ("the claiming party") shall promptly notify the other party in writing, describing the nature and estimated duration of the claiming party's inability to perform due to the force majeure event. The cause of such inability to perform will be remedied by the claiming party with all reasonable dispatch.



27. JANO certifies that JANO, its parent companies, subsidiaries, and affiliates are not barred from entering into this Agreement as a result of a violation of either 720 ILCS 5/33E-3 or 5/33E-4 (bid rigging or bid rotating) or as a result of a violation of 820 ILCS 130/1 *et seq.* (the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act).



AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNUAL TAX LEVY UPON REAL ESTATE SITUATED WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF ST. CLAIR AND THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, SUBJECT TO TAXATION, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING ON THE 1ST DAY OF MAY 2025 AND ENDING ON THE 30TH DAY OF APRIL 2026

THE CITY OF BELLEVILLE, ST. CLAIR COUNTY, ILLINOIS (THE "CITY"), IS A DULY ORGANIZED AND EXISTING MUNICIPALITY CREATED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS.

WHEREAS, the City of Belleville, St. Clair County, Illinois (the “City”) is a home rule unit of local government and authorized under and pursuant to Section 6(1) of Article VII of the Constitution of the State of Illinois and the Special Service Area Tax Law (35 ILCS 200/27-5 *et seq.*), as supplemented and amended (the “SSA Law”) to implement special service area financing; and


