Commercial Occupancy Permits

On May 1, 2008, the City of Belleville adopted Commercial Occupancy procedures, whereas each business that opens in a commercial space must first obtain a Commercial Occupancy Permit in the following instances:

- New business/occupancy
- Under new ownership of an existing business/occupancy
- Temporary/Seasonal business/occupancy
- Building expansion of business/occupancy
- Relocation within city limits of an existing business/occupancy

Once the commercial occupancy application is submitted, fire and building inspections will take place, provided the building meets current code standards and all other requirements are fulfilled, the occupancy permit may be issued. Home-Based Businesses

A home-based business must obtain a Home Occupation Permit, available through the Health, Housing & Building Department. No Commercial Occupancy Permit required.

Business Licenses

In some instances, a Business License is required. Everyone that submits a Commercial Occupancy application must also submit a Business License application for review, if applicable. City staff will determine if a license is required depending on the type of business. All business licenses are issued by the City Clerk's Office. Licenses will not be issued until the Commercial Occupancy Application is completed and approved.

Licenses are on an annual renewal every April 30th.

Liquor License Applications & Resources

Liquor licenses are approved by the Mayor and issued by the City Clerk's Office. Liquor Licenses will require a Special Use Permit through the Zoning Board of Appeals. Contact the Economic Development, Planning & Zoning Department (618) 233-6518, x 1250 for Special Use Permit Requirements.

Retail Liquor Licenses

Businesses interested in obtaining a Retail Liquor License must first contact the Mayor's Office at (618) 233-6518, x1207 to apply.

Special Event Liquor Licenses

Not-for-Profit organizations and businesses currently holding a Retail Liquor License in the City should contact the Mayor's office at (618) 233-6518, x1207 regarding Special Event Liquor Licenses.

All applications for Retail and Special Event Liquor Licenses, must be submitted to the office of the Mayor after completion. The Mayor also serves as the Local Liquor Commissioner for the City.

Permit Requirements & Applications

Any improvements to private property within the corporate city limits of Belleville will require appropriate permits to be obtained through the city's Health, Housing & Building Department. The fees for the permits vary as to the size and scope of the project.

All completed applications must be returned to the Health, Housing & Building Department office. Applications can be submitted via email to building@belleville.net and staff will contact you with approval and notification of permit costs.

The water company may ask you to place your Occupancy Permit in the window or on the door until the water service has been turned on in your name, after which you may take the permit down. For this purpose, it is recommended that you place a copy of the permit- place the permit on the inside of the window or door to protect it from weather and/or theft.

Sewer & Trash Services

The water company will notify Belleville City Hall of activation of your water account, and City Hall will activate your sewer and/or trash services (if applicable). Sewer/Trash bills are mailed out monthly by City of Belleville.

Commercial Refuse

The city offers light commercial services with a four toter maximum. The first toter is provided. Additional toters cost \$80 each. Dumpster service must be contracted to an independent hauler. Contact the Sanitation office for further assistance.

CodeRED® - FREE Emergency Notification for Citizens

CodeRED® is a **FREE** service provided to the citizens of Belleville to notify them about urgent situations that may be occurring in the community.

If you were previously signed up with Hyper-Reach, your information has been transferred to CodeRED®. However, we encourage you to enroll again. When you do, you will see that CodeRED® offers many features that were not previously available through Hyper-Reach.

CodeRED® allows the 9-1-1 Center to quickly send a recorded message and text message to telephones in specific areas and alert residents to any emergency situations that require immediate action. The system delivers critical information to residents and provides guidance on what precautions need to be taken by residents during and after an incident.

CodeRED® is able to send notifications in five ways: landline phone message, cell phone message, text message, TTY, and email. With CodeRED®, the City can inform residents of situations such as a weather emergency, water boil advisory, a lost child, a vicious animal at large, or a street issue.

If you wish to set up your landline phone, cell phone, text message, TTY, or your email account, registration can be completed quickly and easily through CodeRED® by visiting **Belleville.net** and scrolling to the bottom of our homepage to select **Code Red-Emergency Notification**.

If you do not have internet access, you can sign up for CodeRED® by completing a one page application that is available at City Hall, 101 S. Illinois Street, or the Fire Administration Offices at 1125 S. Illinois Street.
